DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL

Senate Bill 680 is the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act of FY 2012-2013. This legislation itemizes capital projects in the aggregate amount of \$7,071,064,000. Of this amount, \$6,986,351,000 will be funded from debt and \$84,713,000 would be funded from current revenues. Debt service for debt-funded projects would be paid from the General Fund in the form of annual appropriations to the Treasury for general obligation debt service.

The following chart illustrates, by project category and the total authorizations, by funding source, for the capital projects itemized in this legislation.

FISCAL NOTE

FISCAL IMPACT:

Capital projects included in this bill that are debt financed are funded by the sale of bonds. These projects are authorized in the amount of \$6,986,351,000. In addition to the amortization of the bonds, an additional cost to the Commonwealth is the interest on the bonds that are sold. The cost to the General Fund cannot be determined at this time since the amount of bonds issued is unknown and the interest rate will be set at the time of the sale of such bonds.
