DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL

House Bill 2025 amends Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes to provide for a 60-day registration card to be issued to an “in-transit” vehicle, or a vehicle acquired in this Commonwealth for transportation to another state for registration or use in the other state. Additionally, the legislation allows the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (Department) to impose a monetary penalty upon a licensed inspection station and/or an inspection mechanic for noncompliance of the law and/or Departmental regulations.

This legislation does the following:

- Amends §1310 (Temporary registration cards) by adding language that allows the Department to issue a 60-day vehicle registration for a vehicle that was acquired in the Commonwealth and being transported to another state for registration or use in the other state;
- Amends §4724 (Suspension of certificates of appointment) by adding language that allows the Department to impose a monetary penalty on an inspection station which is found to be noncompliant with the law and/or Departmental regulations; and
- Amends §4726 (Certification of mechanics) by adding language that allows the Department to impose a monetary penalty, in addition to the currently allowed suspension, upon a mechanic that is found to be noncompliant with the law or Departmental regulations.

This act shall take effect in 60 days.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The enactment of this legislation will have no adverse effect on Commonwealth funds.
