DESCRIPTION

House Bill 1182 amends the Barbers' License Law to authorize licensed barber schools to provide a portion of instruction through distance education.

This legislation allows a school of barbering to offer up to 50% of its curriculum on barbering study and training hours in theory-based subjects through distance education, and it specifies that the curriculum at a school of barbering may not offer practical demonstrations through distance education.

House Bill 1182 defines "distance education" to include curriculum offered by a school of barbering to a student while the student is at a location separate and apart from the school.

This act shall take effect in 60 days.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Enactment of this legislation will have no fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds. The implementation of the provisions of House Bill 1182 can be accomplished within existing staffing and funding levels provided to the Department of State for the State Board of Barber Examiners.
