## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to study
- the Pennsylvania Medicaid Estate Recovery Program to
- determine how much is recovered through the program and if
- further changes to the system are needed in order to return
- funding to the Commonwealth.
- 6 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth is faced with a severe economic
- 7 downturn, a State budget deficit estimated at between \$1 billion
- 8 and \$2 billion, double-digit rate increases in health care
- 9 costs, a growing number of people who need long-term care and an
- 10 escalation in Medicaid costs; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Medicaid is the second largest budget expenditure
- 12 after basic education and has increased more than 50% between
- 13 fiscal years 2000 and 2007; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The demand for long-term services continues to grow
- 15 as this Commonwealth's population ages; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Medicaid is a major payer for long-term care
- 17 facilities; and
- WHEREAS, Federal law requires states to seek recovery for
- 19 payments made for nursing home facilities, home and community-
- 20 based services and their related hospital and prescription drug

- 1 services; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Federal law allows considerable discretion in the
- 3 design of estate recovery programs, allowing states to decide
- 4 such parameters as the targeted population, scope of recovery,
- 5 minimum estate and claim thresholds, exemptions, hardship waiver
- 6 criteria and operations; and
- WHEREAS, Faced with burgeoning costs and pending budget cuts,
- 8 it is prudent to ensure that this Commonwealth is doing all it
- 9 can to recover the taxpayer's money invested in Medicaid; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Budget quick fixes and one-time savings will be more
- 11 difficult to identify in order to maintain services to this
- 12 Commonwealth's neediest residents; and
- WHEREAS, Estate recovery programs provides a cost-effective
- 14 way to offset State costs; therefore be it
- 15 RESOLVED, That the Senate direct the Legislative Budget and
- 16 Finance Committee to study Pennsylvania's Medicaid Estate
- 17 Recovery Program to determine if further changes to the program
- 18 can be implemented to maximize estate recovery, to compare
- 19 Pennsylvania's rate of return to other states, to ensure
- 20 compliance with Federal law, to make recommendations on changes
- 21 to recover additional moneys and to report on how Pennsylvania
- 22 currently uses money collected through the Medicaid Estate
- 23 Recovery Program; and be it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 25 issue a report of its findings and recommendations to the Senate
- 26 no later than July 1, 2009.
