In the near future, I plan on introducing legislation to prevent dental insurers from capping the costs of non-covered dental services, and to prevent insurers from setting fees for dental services for which the dental insurer has no contractual obligation to pay.

Many dentists in my district are telling me that dental insurers are incorporating these billing and payment strategies into their provider contracts because, as they claim, these strategies limit their enrollees' out-of-pocket expenses. When, in fact, insurers clearly are interfering with a dental practices ability to conduct business in the Commonwealth by attempting to control costs of dental services which fall outside the contract between the insurer and the dentist.

It is one thing for an insurer and a provider to agree on a reimbursement schedule for the services covered under a dental policy. It is entirely another matter where an insurer dictates a rate for services that are not covered or even recognized under the provider contract. Put another way: An insurer should not be able to compel a dentist to charge certain rates for services outside the provider contract, nor should an insurer interfere with a dentist's relationship with his or her patient.
