SUBJECT: Legislation - Check Off for Animal Spaying and Neutering Procedures

As you all know, the current economic conditions have taken a toll on all levels of state and local government in Pennsylvania. These conditions have forced governmental entities across the Commonwealth to make difficult decisions as it relates to the manner in which funds are disbursed. Unfortunately, many worthwhile programs, plans and organizations have felt the financial crunch of fund reductions or eliminations.

One specific area that has been hit hard by funding reductions is animal shelters and care centers. Shelters and other organizations provide care to wayward animals and are having to do so with small budgets that are largely subsidized by public donation. One major cost these shelters and care centers incur relates to spaying and neutering animals. The practice of spaying and neutering helps control the pet population which serves to reduce the number of animals that end up living in shelters.

With the cost of these procedures in mind, I will be introducing legislation in the near future which will establish an income tax check off in which taxpayers would be permitted to contribute part or all of a state tax refund to a newly created fund. This fund, the "Spaying and Neutering Fund" will serve to provide grant money to those organizations and individuals that provide affordable spaying and neutering services.

Please join me in my efforts to help control the pet population while also assisting people and organizations with the cost they incur when spaying and neutering their pet. ## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), entitled "An 1 act relating to tax reform and State taxation by codifying 2 and enumerating certain subjects of taxation and imposing 3 taxes thereon; providing procedures for the payment, 4 collection, administration and enforcement thereof; providing 5 for tax credits in certain cases; conferring powers and 6 imposing duties upon the Department of Revenue, certain 7 employers, fiduciaries, individuals, persons, corporations 8 and other entities; prescribing crimes, offenses and 9 penalties, " in personal income tax, establishing and 10 providing for contributions to the Spaying and Neutering 11 Fund. 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 The act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as 15 Section 1. the Tax Reform Code of 1971, is amended by adding a section to 16 17 read: Section 315.10. Contributions to Spaying and Neutering 18

Fund. -- (1) The department shall provide a space on the

Pennsylvania individual income tax return form whereby an

individual may voluntarily designate a contribution of any

amount desired to be utilized for affordable spaying and

- 1 neutering procedures for dogs and cats.
- 2 (b) The amount so designated on the individual income tax
- 3 return form shall be deducted from the tax refund to which the
- 4 <u>individual</u> is entitled and shall not constitute a charge against
- 5 the income tax revenues due to the Commonwealth.
- 6 (c) The department shall determine annually the total amount
- 7 designated under this section, less reasonable administrative
- 8 costs, and shall report the amount to the State Treasurer who
- 9 shall transfer the amount from the General Fund to the Spaying
- 10 and Neutering Fund, which is hereby established as a special
- 11 fund in the State Treasury. All money so deposited shall be used
- 12 solely to provide affordable spaying and neutering procedures.
- 13 Grants from the fund shall be made by the Secretary of
- 14 Agriculture.
- 15 (d) The department shall provide adequate information
- 16 concerning the checkoff for affordable spaying and neutering
- 17 procedures in its instructions which accompany State income tax
- 18 return forms. The information concerning the checkoff shall
- 19 include the listing of an address furnished by the Department of
- 20 Agriculture to which contributions may be sent by taxpayers
- 21 wishing to contribute to this effort but who do not receive
- 22 refunds. Additionally, the Department of Agriculture shall be
- 23 charged with the duty to conduct a public information campaign
- 24 on the availability of the checkoff and grant opportunities to
- 25 Pennsylvania taxpayers.
- 26 (e) The Department of Agriculture shall report annually to
- 27 the respective committees of the Senate and the House of
- 28 Representatives which have jurisdiction over health matters on
- 29 the amount received via the checkoff plan and how the funds were
- 30 <u>utilized.</u>

- (f) The General Assembly may, form time to time, appropriate
- 2 <u>funds for affordable spaying and neutering procedures.</u>
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
