After researching the history and accomplishments of the 109th Infantry and the sacrifices of the soldiers within it, I felt humbled by what those who had served in the infantry had given over the years to secure and protect our freedom. You will find attached a copy of an act that documents the history of the 109th Infantry. The units of this regiment date back to the American Revolution. Personnel of the 109th were, and are to this day, engaged in all wars of the nation.

Because of the sacrifices of its personnel, great differences occurred in both World War I and II. The service of the 109th Infantry in the Battle of the Bulge is legendary.

For all these reasons and more, I feel honored to introduce legislation to name the 8th Avenue Bridge over the Lackawanna River in downtown Carbondale as the 109th Infantry Bridge.
