Resolution Recognizing Erie County as the Freshwater Fishing Capital of Pennsylvania

In the near future, I will be introducing a resolution recognizing Erie County as the Freshwater Fishing Capital of Pennsylvania.

Lake Erie offers a myriad of recreational opportunities, such as swimming, hiking, boating, and fishing at Presque Isle State Park and the 76.6 miles of Pennsylvania shoreline, which are located in Erie County. Many of these activities have always attracted residents from the northwestern portion of the state, but exceptional sportfishing is now attracting anglers from throughout the country. The lake, with its mix of warm and cold water, supports a variety of fish species that offer anglers a unique fishing experience.

While steelhead fishing occurs year round, fall and winter offer thrilling sportfishing opportunities for steelhead on the Erie County shoreline as these fish migrate upstream to spawn in local tributaries. The walleye is another gamefish eagerly sought by anglers.
