A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for exemptions and special provisions.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby resolves as follows:
6	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
7	Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of
8	Article XI:
9	That section 2(b)(vi) of Article VIII be amended to read:
10	§ 2. Exemptions and special provisions.
11	* * *
12	(b) The General Assembly may, by law:
13	* * *
14	(vi) Authorize local taxing authorities to exclude from
15	taxation an amount based on the assessed value of homestead
16	property. The exclusions authorized by this clause shall not
17	exceed [one-half of the median assessed value of all] <u>100% of</u>

1 <u>the assessed value of each</u> homestead property within a local 2 taxing jurisdiction. A local taxing authority may not increase 3 the millage rate of its tax on real property to pay for these 4 exclusions.

Upon the first passage by the General 6 Section 2. (a) 7 Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the 8 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article 9 10 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in 11 12 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of this proposed constitutional amendment. 13

14 Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this (b) 15 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the 16 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the 17 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required 18 19 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such 20 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of 21 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the 22 Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment 23 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first 24 primary, general or municipal election which meets the 25 requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article 26 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least three months after the proposed constitutional amendment is 27 28 passed by the General Assembly.

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
