- Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for
- the offense of scattering rubbish, for the acknowledgment of
- littering provisions and for the offense of depositing of waste and other material on highway, property or waters.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Section 6501(b)(1) and (2) of Title 18 of the
- 9 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the
- 10 subsection is amended by adding paragraphs to read:
- 11 § 6501. Scattering rubbish.

- 13 (b) Penalty.--
- 14 (1) A person who violates subsection (a) (1) or (2) is
- guilty of a summary offense for the first offense and upon
- 16 conviction thereof shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not
- less than \$50 nor more than [\$300] \$1,000 or to imprisonment
- for not more than 90 days, or both, as provided in paragraph
- 19 (6).

A person who violates subsection (a)(1) or (2) is 1 2 guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree for the second and subsequent offense and upon conviction thereof shall be 3 4 sentenced to pay a fine of not less than [\$300] \$100 nor more than [\$1,000] \$2,000, as provided in paragraph (6). The 5 6 person also may be sentenced to imprisonment or to performing 7 a community service for a period not to exceed one year. 8 9 (6) Fines are to be imposed according to the following 10 schedule: 11 (i) For littering of five pounds or less for the 12 first offense, the fine shall be not less than \$50 nor 13 more than \$300. (ii) For littering of more than five pounds but less 14 15 than 100 pounds or 25 cubic feet for the first offense, the fine shall be not less than \$300 nor more than \$500. 16 (iii) For littering of more than 100 pounds or 25 17 cubic feet or more for the first offense, the fine shall 18 be not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000. 19 20 (iv) For littering of less than five pounds for the 21 second and subsequent offense, the fine shall be not less 22 than \$100 nor more than \$500. 23 (v) For littering of more than five pounds but less than 100 pounds or 25 cubic feet for the second and 24 25 subsequent offense, the fine shall be not less than \$500 26 nor more than \$1,000. 27 (vi) For littering of more than 100 pounds or 25 28 cubic feet for the second and subsequent offense, the fine shall be not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$2,000. 29

- 3 (e) Disposition of fines, etc.--[Revenue] <u>Except as</u>
