## AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the rights of individuals to purchase private
- health care insurance; and prohibiting certain governmental
- 3 action.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Freedom of
- 8 Choice in Health Care Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Commonwealth agency." The Commonwealth, including the
- 14 Executive Department, Commonwealth departments and boards and
- 15 commissions; an independent administrative department, board and
- 16 commission; or a public official thereof, acting under the color
- 17 of State law.
- 18 "Direct purchase." Payment for lawful health care services

- 1 without a public or private third party, not including an
- 2 employer, paying for any portion of the service.
- 3 "Health care system." Any public or private entity whose
- 4 function or purpose is the management of, processing of, or
- 5 enrollment of individuals for or payment for, in full or in
- 6 part, health care services, health care data or health care
- 7 information for its participants.
- 8 "Penalties or fines." Any civil or criminal penalty or fine,
- 9 tax, salary or wage withholding or surcharge, or any named fee
- 10 with a similar effect established by law or rule by a
- 11 government-established, government-created or government-
- 12 controlled agency that is used to punish or discourage the
- 13 exercise of rights protected under this section.
- 14 Section 3. Individual rights.
- The people shall have the right to enter into private
- 16 contracts with health care providers for health care services
- 17 and to purchase private health care coverage. The legislature
- 18 may not require any individual to participate in any health care
- 19 system or plan, nor may it impose a penalty or fine, of any
- 20 type, for choosing to obtain or decline health care coverage or
- 21 for participation in any particular health care system or plan.
- 22 Section 4. Freedom of choice in health care.
- 23 (a) Prohibited actions.--To preserve the freedom of
- 24 Pennsylvanians to provide for their health care:
- 25 (1) A law or rule shall not compel, through penalties
- and fines, directly or indirectly, any individual, employer
- or health care provider to participate in any health care
- 28 system.
- 29 (2) An individual or employer may pay directly for
- 30 lawful health care services and shall not be required to pay

- 1 penalties or fines for paying directly for lawful health care
- 2 services. A health care provider may accept direct payment
- 3 for lawful health care services and shall not be required to
- 4 pay penalties or fines for accepting direct payment from a
- 5 individual or employer for lawful health care services.
- 6 (b) Private health care insurance. -- Subject to reasonable
- 7 and necessary rules that do not substantially limit an
- 8 individual's options, the purchase or sale of health insurance
- 9 in private health care systems shall not be prohibited by rule
- 10 or law.
- 11 (c) Interpretation.--This section does not affect:
- 12 (1) Which health care services a health care provider or
- hospital is required to perform or provide.
- 14 (2) Which health care services are permitted by law.
- 15 (3) The terms or conditions of any health care system to
- the extent that those terms and conditions do not have the
- effect of punishing an individual or employer for paying
- 18 directly for lawful health care services or a health care
- 19 provider or hospital for accepting direct payment from an
- individual or employer for lawful health care services.
- 21 Section 5. Participation in related laws.
- Neither the Governor nor the Department of Health, the
- 23 Department of Public Welfare or any other Commonwealth agency
- 24 shall participate in the compliance with any Federal law,
- 25 regulation or policy that would compromise the freedom of choice
- 26 in health care of any resident of this Commonwealth.
- 27 Section 6. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect immediately.
