AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto, " in school health services, further 5 providing for definitions; and providing for training of 6 school employees in diabetes care and management, for 7 diabetes care in schools, for possession and use of diabetes medication and monitoring equipment and for liability. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 11 hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Section 1401 of the act of March 10, 1949 12
- (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is 13
- 14 amended by adding clauses to read:
- 15 Section 1401. Definitions. -- As used in this article --
- 16 * * *
- (13) "Diabetes medical management plan" means a document 17
- describing the medical orders or diabetes regimen developed and 18
- 19 signed by the student's health care provider and parent or
- 20 quardian.
- (14) "Service agreement" means a student's Section 504 21

- 1 service agreement pursuant to section 504 of the Rehabilitation
- 2 Act of 1973 (Public Law 93-112, 29 U.S.C. § 794) and 22 Pa. Code
- 3 Ch. 15 (relating to protected handicapped students).
- 4 Section 2. The act is amended by adding sections to read:
- 5 Section 1414.2. Training of School Employes in Diabetes Care
- 6 and Management. -- (a) Within one hundred twenty (120) days of
- 7 the effective date of this section, the Department of Health, in
- 8 coordination with the Department of Education, the American
- 9 Diabetes Association, educators and health professionals, shall
- 10 make training modules and guidelines for the instruction of
- 11 school employes in diabetes care and treatment available on its
- 12 publicly accessible Internet website. The training modules shall
- 13 <u>include instruction in a school entity's obligations under 22</u>
- 14 Pa. Code § 12.41 (relating to student services) and its
- 15 responsibilities to comply with section 504 of the
- 16 Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Public Law 93-112, 29 U.S.C. § 794)
- 17 and 22 Pa. Code Ch. 15 (relating to protected handicapped
- 18 students). At a minimum, the training modules shall include
- 19 instruction in:
- 20 (1) An overview of all types of diabetes.
- 21 (2) Means of monitoring blood glucose.
- 22 (3) The symptoms and treatment for blood glucose levels
- 23 outside of target ranges as well as hypoglycemia, hyperglycemia
- 24 and other potential emergencies.
- 25 (4) Techniques on administering glucagon and insulin.
- 26 (b) Within one hundred twenty (120) days of the effective
- 27 date of this section the chief school administrator or a
- 28 designee shall identify at least one school employe, who is not
- 29 the school nurse and who does not need to be a licensed health
- 30 care provider, in each school building attended by a student

- 1 with diabetes. An identified employe shall complete the training
- 2 outlined in subsection (a) or training offered by a licensed
- 3 health care provider that includes substantially the same
- 4 <u>information as outlined in subsection (a).</u>
- 5 (c) A school employe who is not a licensed health care
- 6 provider may be designated in a student's service agreement to
- 7 administer diabetes medication, use monitoring equipment and
- 8 provide other diabetes care. A school entity may require the
- 9 designated employe to complete the training required under
- 10 subsection (b) or training from a licensed health care provider,
- 11 or both, in the administration of diabetes medications or use of
- 12 monitoring equipment. Training provided to school employes shall
- 13 be coordinated by the chief school administrator or a designee.
- 14 School entities may include the training in the continuing
- 15 education plan submitted by the school entity to the Department
- 16 of Education under section 1205.1.
- 17 (d) Notwithstanding any other statute or regulation
- 18 restricting the functions that may be performed by persons other
- 19 than licensed health care providers, school employes are
- 20 <u>authorized to perform diabetes care for students for which they</u>
- 21 have been designated and trained under this section. School
- 22 employes shall only be authorized to administer diabetes
- 23 medications via injection or infusion following training by a
- 24 school nurse or other qualified health care professional. The
- 25 provision of training by a licensed health care professional in
- 26 accordance with this section shall not be construed to violate a
- 27 <u>licensing-related statute or regulation.</u>
- 28 (e) For purposes of this section, "school entity" means a
- 29 school district, intermediate unit, area vocational-technical
- 30 school, charter school or cyber charter school.

- 1 Section 1414.3. Diabetes Care in Schools.--(a) A parent or
- 2 quardian of a student with diabetes who desires that the student
- 3 receive diabetes-related care in a school setting shall provide
- 4 the school entity with written authorization for the care and
- 5 instructions from the student's health care provider, consistent
- 6 with the school entity's policies regarding the provision of
- 7 school health services. The required authorizations may be
- 8 submitted as part of a diabetes medical management plan.
- 9 (b) All diabetes-related care provided to students shall be
- 10 consistent with the school health program established by the
- 11 governing body of the school entity and any accommodations
- 12 outlined in a student's service agreement.
- 13 (c) A student's service agreement may require a school
- 14 entity to provide the driver of a school bus or school vehicle
- 15 who provides transportation to a student with diabetes with an
- 16 information sheet that:
- 17 (1) Identifies the student with diabetes.
- 18 (2) Identifies potential emergencies that may occur as a
- 19 result of the student's diabetes and the appropriate responses
- 20 to such emergencies.
- 21 (3) Provides the telephone number of a contact person in
- 22 case of an emergency involving the student with diabetes.
- 23 (d) For purposes of this section:
- 24 "School bus" means a school bus as defined in 75 Pa.C.S. §
- 25 102 (relating to definitions).
- "School entity" means a school district, intermediate unit,
- 27 area vocational-technical school, charter school or cyber
- 28 <u>charter school</u>.
- "School vehicle" means a school vehicle as defined in 75
- 30 Pa.C.S. § 102.

- 1 Section 1414.4. Possession and Use of Diabetes Medication and
- 2 Monitoring Equipment. -- (a) A school entity shall require the
- 3 parent or quardian of a student with diabetes who desires that
- 4 the student possess and self-administer diabetes medication and
- 5 monitoring equipment in a school setting to provide the
- 6 following:
- 7 (1) A written statement from the student's health care
- 8 provider that provides the name of the drug, the dose, the times
- 9 when the medication is to be taken or the monitoring equipment
- 10 to be used, the specified time period for which the medication
- 11 or monitoring equipment is authorized to be used and the
- 12 diagnosis or reason the medicine or monitoring equipment is
- 13 needed. The student's health care provider shall indicate the
- 14 potential of any serious reaction to the medication that may
- 15 occur, as well as any necessary emergency response. The
- 16 student's health care provider shall state whether the student
- 17 is competent to self-administer the medication or monitoring
- 18 equipment and whether the student is able to practice proper
- 19 safety precautions for the handling and disposal of the
- 20 medication and monitoring equipment.
- 21 (2) A written request from the parent or quardian that the
- 22 school entity comply with the direction of the student's health
- 23 care provider. The parent's request shall include a statement
- 24 relieving the school entity or any school employe of any
- 25 <u>responsibility for the prescribed medication or monitoring</u>
- 26 equipment and acknowledging that the school entity bears no
- 27 responsibility for ensuring that the medication is taken or the
- 28 monitoring equipment used.
- 29 (3) A demonstration of competency by the student satisfying
- 30 the school nurse that the student is capable of self-

- 1 administration of the medication or monitoring equipment.
- 2 (4) A written acknowledgment by the student that the student
- 3 has received instruction from the student's health care provider
- 4 on proper safety precautions for the handling and disposal of
- 5 the medications and monitoring equipment. The written
- 6 acknowledgment shall also contain a provision stating that the
- 7 student will not allow other students to have access to the
- 8 medication and monitoring equipment and that the student
- 9 <u>understands appropriate safeguards</u>.
- 10 (b) A school entity may revoke or restrict a student's
- 11 privileges to possess or self-administer diabetes medication or
- 12 monitoring equipment due to noncompliance with school rules or
- 13 provisions of a student's service agreement or due to
- 14 demonstrated unwillingness or inability of the student to
- 15 safequard the medication or monitoring equipment from access by
- 16 other students.
- 17 (c) A school entity that restricts a student from possessing
- 18 or self-administering diabetes medication or monitoring
- 19 equipment pursuant to subsection (b) shall ensure that the
- 20 <u>diabetes medication or monitoring equipment are appropriately</u>
- 21 stored in a readily accessible place in the school building
- 22 attended by the student. The school entity shall notify
- 23 appropriate school employes regarding the location of the
- 24 diabetes medication or monitoring equipment and means to access
- 25 them.
- 26 (d) For purposes of this section, "school entity" means a
- 27 school district, intermediate unit, area vocational-technical
- 28 school, charter school or cyber charter school.
- 29 Section 1414.5. Liability.--Nothing in sections 1414.2,
- 30 1414.3 or 1414.4 shall be construed to create, establish or

- 1 expand any civil liability on the part of any school entity or
- 2 school employe.
- 3 Section 1414.6. Diabetes Care in Nonpublic Schools.--(a) A
- 4 nonpublic school shall comply with the training of school
- 5 employes and provision of diabetes-related care to a student
- 6 with diabetes required under sections 1414.2, 1414.3 and 1414.4.
- 7 A written education plan that outlines the aids and related
- 8 services required to meet the academic needs of the student with
- 9 diabetes may take the place of a service agreement for a student
- 10 with diabetes attending a nonpublic school unless a service
- 11 agreement is otherwise required under law or regulation.
- 12 (b) No nonpublic school employe or nonpublic school employe
- 13 shall be liable for civil damages as a result of the activities
- 14 authorized by sections 1414.2, 1414.3 and 1414.4, except that an
- 15 employe may be liable for willful misconduct.
- 16 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
