

AN ACT

1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in limitation of time
3 relating to criminal proceedings, further providing for no
4 limitation applicable and for other offenses.

5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6 hereby enacts as follows:

7 Section 1. Sections 5551 and 5552(b)(1) of Title 42 of the
8 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:

9 § 5551. No limitation applicable.

10 A prosecution for the following offenses may be commenced at
11 any time:

12 (1) Murder.

13 (2) Voluntary manslaughter.

14 (3) Conspiracy to commit murder or solicitation to
15 commit murder if a murder results from the conspiracy or
16 solicitation.

17 (4) Any felony alleged to have been perpetrated in
18 connection with a murder of the first or second degree, as
19 set forth in 18 Pa.C.S. § 2502(a) or (b) and (d) (relating to

1 murder).

2 (5) A violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3742 (relating to
3 accidents involving death or personal injury) or 3732
4 (relating to homicide by vehicle) if the accused was the
5 driver of a vehicle involved in an accident resulting in the
6 death of any person.

7 (6) A violation of 18 Pa.C.S. § 2702(a)(1), (2), (4) or
8 (7) (relating to aggravated assault) if the accused knew the
9 victim was a law enforcement officer and the law enforcement
10 officer was acting within the scope of the officer's duties.

11 (7) A violation of 18 Pa.C.S. § 3212 (relating to
12 infanticide).

13 § 5552. Other offenses.

14 * * *

15 (b) Major offenses.--A prosecution for any of the following
16 offenses must be commenced within five years after it is
17 committed:

18 (1) Under the following provisions of Title 18 (relating
19 to crimes and offenses):

20 Section 901 (relating to criminal attempt) involving
21 attempt to commit murder where no murder occurs.

22 Section 902 (relating to criminal solicitation)
23 involving solicitation to commit murder where no murder
24 occurs.

25 Section 903 (relating to criminal conspiracy)
26 involving conspiracy to commit murder where no murder
27 occurs.

28 Section 911 (relating to corrupt organizations).

29 Section 2702 (relating to aggravated assault).

30 Section 2706 (relating to terroristic threats).

1 Section 2713 (relating to neglect of care-dependent
2 person).

3 Section 2901 (relating to kidnapping).

4 Section 3211 (relating to abortion on unborn child of
5 24 or more weeks gestational age).

6 Section 3301 (relating to arson and related
7 offenses).

8 Section 3502 (relating to burglary).

9 Section 3701 (relating to robbery).

10 Section 3921 (relating to theft by unlawful taking or
11 disposition) through section 3933 (relating to unlawful
12 use of computer).

13 Section 4101 (relating to forgery).

14 Section 4107 (relating to deceptive or fraudulent
15 business practices).

16 Section 4108 (relating to commercial bribery and
17 breach of duty to act disinterestedly).

18 Section 4109 (relating to rigging publicly exhibited
19 contest).

20 Section 4117 (relating to insurance fraud).

21 Section 4701 (relating to bribery in official and
22 political matters) through section 4703 (relating to
23 retaliation for past official action).

24 Section 4902 (relating to perjury) through section
25 4912 (relating to impersonating a public servant).

26 Section 4952 (relating to intimidation of witnesses
27 or victims).

28 Section 4953 (relating to retaliation against
29 witness, victim or party).

30 Section 5101 (relating to obstructing administration

1 of law or other governmental function).

2 Section 5111 (relating to dealing in proceeds of
3 unlawful activities).

4 Section 5512 (relating to lotteries, etc.) through
5 section 5514 (relating to pool selling and bookmaking).

6 Section 5902(b) (relating to prostitution and related
7 offenses).

8 Section 6111(g) (2) and (4) (relating to sale or
9 transfer of firearms).

11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
