AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 2, 1937 (P.L.1198, No.308), entitled 1 "An act relating to employes and organizations thereof; 2 defining labor disputes; prescribing the procedure by which 3 and the conditions under which injunctions may be granted in 4 such disputes, and the scope thereof; declaring certain 5 6 undertakings and promises between employers and employes 7 contrary to public policy and void; prescribing the nature of proof necessary in actions arising out of labor disputes 8 against persons or associations; prescribing the terms and 9 conditions for bonds to be furnished prior to the issuance of 10 injunctions; prescribing the procedure in case of appeal from 11 granting injunctions; limiting the duration of temporary and 12 permanent injunctions in case of labor disputes; and 13 providing for the payment of costs; and repealing all acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith, " imposing a duty on 14 15 certain law enforcement officers regarding enforcement of 16 17 temporary restraining orders and temporary and permanent injunctions. 18
- 19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 20 hereby enacts as follows:
- 21 Section 1. The act of June 2, 1937 (P.L.1198, No.308), known
- 22 as the Labor Anti-Injunction Act, is amended by adding a section
- 23 to read:
- 24 <u>Section 15.1. Upon request of the plaintiff</u>, the following
- 25 shall enforce a restraining order or temporary or permanent

- 1 injunction:
- 2 (1) a police department with the appropriate jurisdiction;
- 3 (2) a sheriff's office with the appropriate jurisdiction;
- 4 (3) the Pennsylvania State Police; or
- 5 (4) another law enforcement agency having jurisdiction over
- 6 a person, organization or entity subject to an order under this
- 7 <u>act.</u>
- 8 Upon approval of the plaintiff's application, the court shall
- 9 require the restrained or enjoined person, organization or
- 10 entity that did not voluntarily obey the court order to pay a
- 11 legal fee, cost or other fee incurred by the plaintiff in
- 12 <u>enforcing the court order.</u>
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
