## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 5 6 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 17 number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 18 19 commissions shall be determined, " providing for toll-free 20 response telephone number. 21

- 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 23 hereby enacts as follows:
- 24 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known
- 25 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a
- 26 section to read:
- 27 <u>Section 1938-A. Toll-free Response Telephone Number.--The</u>

- 1 Department of Environmental Protection shall establish and
- 2 maintain, or cause to be maintained, a toll-free Statewide 24-
- 3 hour, seven-days-a-week response telephone number, 1-855-225-
- 4 5442 or 1-855-CALL-4GAS, exclusively for the reporting of
- 5 suspected violations of the laws relating to oil and gas.
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
