A RESOLUTION

- Urging the City of Philadelphia to establish a year-round program providing for the safe removal and adequate disposal 2
- of illegally discarded waste tires. 3
- WHEREAS, The House of Representatives notes the various 4
- issues associated with the improper disposal of waste tires, 5
- including the economic, environmental and health impact that it 6
- poses to the landscape, property values and citizens of 7
- 8 Philadelphia; and
- WHEREAS, The House of Representatives acknowledges that there 9
- exists a critical need for the City of Philadelphia to implement 10
- a year-round tire cleanup program and to invest or participate 11
- in environmentally safe tire recycling programs established 12
- within this Commonwealth; and 13
- WHEREAS, Waste tires pose an even greater threat to the 14
- health and welfare of the citizens of Philadelphia as they 15
- collect rain water and serve as an optimal habitat for breeding 16
- mosquitoes, which may be the carriers of the potentially fatal 17
- West Nile virus; and 18

- 1 WHEREAS, Additional dangers such as waste tire pile fires are
- 2 equally hazardous and often release toxic gases into the
- 3 atmosphere which adversely affect the lives of human beings and
- 4 the surrounding ecosystem; and
- 5 WHEREAS, On March 14, 1996, the smoldering waste tire pile
- 6 fire that occurred near an I-95 overpass in Philadelphia is
- 7 proof of the impact of waste tire pollution; and
- 8 WHEREAS, According to the Pennsylvania Department of
- 9 Environmental Protection, in 1996 it was estimated that 36
- 10 million waste tires were discarded in piles throughout
- 11 Pennsylvania; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Notwithstanding the successful collaboration between
- 13 the General Assembly, the Pennsylvania Department of
- 14 Environmental Protection and local governments in past years, it
- 15 is estimated that there are approximately 2.43 million waste
- 16 tires that remain to be cleaned up in this Commonwealth; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The establishment of a year-round waste tire removal
- 18 program would effectively address the public health issues and
- 19 have a positive impact upon our environment as a result of safe
- 20 and proper waste tire disposal through the use of tire
- 21 remediation facilities; and
- 22 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives encourages the City of
- 23 Philadelphia to increase the scope of its current "Tire Round
- 24 Up" program by evolving it into a year-round program; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The City of Philadelphia is further encouraged to
- 26 work closely with its city officials and to seek grants
- 27 allocated for the purpose of funding beautification projects and
- 28 other environmentally oriented programs; therefore be it
- 29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the City of
- 30 Philadelphia to establish a year-round waste tire removal

- 1 program for the purpose of safely and adequately disposing of
- 2 illegally discarded waste tires.
