- 7 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 Section 442.4. Placement screenings. -- (a) The county agency
- 9 shall screen a child who is placed outside the child's home in a
- 10 foster care or adoption assistance program and who is not
- 11 eligible to receive federally funded Aid to Families with
- 12 Dependent Children Foster Care (AFDC-FC) benefits for Federal
- 13 Supplemental Security Income (SSI) eligibility at the time of
- 14 placement for potential eligibility for the Federal SSI program
- 15 <u>utilizing the quidelines established under the Social Security</u>
- 16 Act (49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 301 et seq.). If the child is
- 17 determined to be eligible through the screening process, the
- 18 county agency shall submit an application for benefits to the
- 19 Social Security Administration on behalf of the child within ten
- 20 days of completion of the screening.
- 21 (b) (1) Prior to the termination of jurisdiction over a
- 22 dependent child who is 18 years of age or older, the county
- 23 agency shall screen the child for the Federal SSI program
- 24 utilizing the quidelines established under the Social Security
- 25 Act.
- 26 (2) The screening shall use the Title XVI of the Social
- 27 Security Act criteria for eligibility and shall occur when the
- 28 child is at least 17 years of age and not older than 17 years
- 29 and six months of age. The county agency shall submit an
- 30 application to the Social Security Administration on behalf of a

- 1 child who is screened as being likely to be eliqible for Federal
- 2 SSI benefits 90 days prior to the child reaching 18 years of
- 3 age.
