A RESOLUTION

Recognizing and honoring firefighters throughout this 1 Commonwealth for their bravery, dedication and heroism and designating May 4, 2013, as "Firefighters' Day" in 2 3 Pennsylvania. 4 WHEREAS, In 1736, Benjamin Franklin founded the first 5 volunteer fire company, Union Fire Company, in Philadelphia, 6 making Pennsylvania the birthplace of the volunteer fire service 7 in North America; and 8 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has approximately 2,400 fire companies, 9 which amounts to the largest number of fire departments 10 nationally. The Commonwealth serves as a national leader in the 11 number of career and paid personnel providing emergency 12 services; and 13 WHEREAS, In this Commonwealth, volunteers staff 95% of all 14 fire companies. More than 70,000 volunteers, the largest number 15 of volunteer firefighters in the nation, serve on fire companies 16 within this Commonwealth; and 17 WHEREAS, On average, ten Pennsylvania firefighters die in the 18

1 firefighters in their efforts to guarantee safety within their communities. It serves as a time to thank current and past 2 firefighters for their contributions and to remember those men 3 and women who have made the ultimate sacrifice to save and 4 5 protect lives in their neighborhoods; therefore be it 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize and honor the bravery and sacrifice of firefighters in this 7 Commonwealth, extend thanks for their service and, on the 8 occasion of International Firefighters' Day, designate May 4, 9 2013, as "International Firefighters' Day" in Pennsylvania; and 10 11 be it further

12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge all Members of the General Assembly and elected officials and residents 13 across this Commonwealth to make efforts to honor and remember 14 firefighters in Pennsylvania for their dedication, service and 15 16 sacrifice, including the giving of their lives, in order to protect the lives and property of the citizens of this 17 Commonwealth. Such efforts may include wearing and displaying 18 blue and red ribbons pinned together, participating in a 19 memorial or recognition event, rising together in a public 20 meeting or gathering in honor of the sacrifices of firefighters 21 or by at least pausing for a minute at noon on the first Sunday 22 23 in May as a sign of gratitude for their service.
