## AN ACT

Designating State Route 233 from the eastern corporate limits of Newville Borough to the Cumberland County/Perry County line as the Army Sgt. Timothy L. Hayslett Memorial Highway.

Section 1. Army Sgt. Timothy L. Hayslett Memorial Highway.

- (a.) Declaration of policy.-- the General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
  - (1) Timothy L. Hayslett was born May 17, 1977, in Winston-Salem, NC. He moved to Newville, PA., Cumberland County, along with his family in 1983. He attended Big Spring High School, Newville, and entered the United States Army in 1995 where he served for 8 years.
  - (2) Army Sgt. Timothy L Hayslett was assigned to the Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 1st Battalion, 37<sup>th</sup> Armored Regiment, 1<sup>st</sup> Armored Division, at Friedberg, Germany. He died November 15, 2003, at 26 years of age, while on patrol in Baghdad, Iraq, when an improvised exploding device (IED) struck his Humvee.
  - (3) Army Sgt. Hayslett was awarded the Purple Heart and the Bronze Star Medal for his wounds sustained in combat against an enemy of the United States. He was also awarded the Good Conduct Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, the Global War on Terror Service Medal, and the Iraq Campaign Medal with Two Bronze Service Stars.

- (4) Army Sgt. Timothy Hayslett, beloved son of Guy L. and Mary D. Hayslett, of Newville, PA, was courageously serving his country at the time of his death and his excellence as a soldier has been extolled by many.
- (b.) Designation.— State Route 233, from the eastern corporate limits of Newville Borough to the Cumberland County/Perry County line, is hereby designated as the Army Sgt. Timothy L. Hayslett Memorial Highway.
- (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs to indicate the designation under subsection (b).Section 2. Effective date.

This act shall take effect in 60 days.
