AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 65 (Public Officers) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in ethics standards and financial
- disclosure, prohibiting certain transportation, lodging and
- 4 hospitality and providing for exceptions.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 65 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding sections to read:
- 9 § 1103.1. Transportation, lodging and hospitality.
- 10 (a) General rule. -- No person from whom a public official or
- 11 a public employee is prohibited under this chapter from
- 12 receiving any gift of economic value shall provide the public
- 13 servant with more than \$100 in transportation, lodging or
- 14 hospitality at any single or series of events occurring within a
- 15 24-hour period. The amount of the transportation, hospitality or
- 16 lodging shall not exceed \$100, regardless of the number of
- 17 persons or entities providing the food, drink or refreshments.
- 18 (b) Annual limit.--In no event shall such person provide

- 1 transportation, hospitality or lodging to a public official or
- 2 public employee valued at more than \$650 in the aggregate during
- 3 the calendar year.
- 4 (c) Calculation of limit.--Where a group of public officials
- 5 or public employees are invited to an event, the \$100 limit is
- 6 calculated by dividing the total cost of the food, drink and
- 7 refreshments by the number of persons invited to the event.
- 8 § 1103.2. Exceptions.
- 9 The prohibition stated in section 1103.1 (relating to
- 10 transportation, lodging and hospitality) shall not apply to the
- 11 following:
- 12 (1) Gifts or other things of value from a relative or
- friend, unless the relative or friend is in a restricted
- relationship as delineated in this chapter. The term "friend"
- shall not include a registered lobbyist or principal.
- 16 (2) A "contribution," as defined in section 1621 of the
- 17 act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the
- Pennsylvania Election Code, lawfully made under that act.
- 19 (3) Informational materials that are sent to the office
- of the public official in the form of books, articles,
- 21 periodicals, other written materials, audiotapes, videotapes
- or other forms of communication for nonentertainment
- 23 purposes.
- 24 (4) Awards or prizes that are given to competitors in
- 25 contests or events open to the public, including random
- 26 <u>drawings.</u>
- 27 (5) Honorary degrees and awards and associated travel,
- 28 <u>food</u>, refreshments and entertainment provided in the
- 29 presentation of the degrees and awards.
- 30 (6) Training provided to a public official or public

1	employee, if the training is in the interest of the
2	governmental entity. This paragraph shall include food and
3	refreshments furnished to all attendees as an integral part
4	of the training.
5	(7) An educational mission, including a meeting with
6	government officials, either foreign or domestic, intended to
7	educate public officials on matters of public policy, to
8	which the public official may be invited to participate along
9	with other Federal, State or local public officials and
10	community leaders.
11	(8) Anything paid for by the Federal, State or other
12	government or governmental entity under a government
13	contract.
14	(9) A plaque, trophy or other item that is substantially
15	commemorative in nature and has minimal value.
16	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
