A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating February 15, 2014, as "Angelman Syndrome Awareness
- 2 Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Angelman Syndrome is a neurological disorder that
- 4 occurs in one in 15,000 live births; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Fifty percent of individuals with Angelman Syndrome
- 6 are originally misdiagnosed, often as having cerebral palsy or
- 7 autism; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Angelman Syndrome is characterized by severe
- 9 intellectual and developmental disabilities, speech limitations,
- 10 motor difficulties, seizures, jerky movements (especially hand-
- 11 flapping), sleep disturbances, frequent laughter or smiling and
- 12 usually a happy demeanor; and
- WHEREAS, Individuals with Angelman Syndrome can have a normal
- 14 life span and generally do not show developmental regression as
- 15 they age; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Late or misdiagnoses may cause individuals to lose

- 1 opportunities for early intervention programs, resources,
- 2 personalized support and lifesaving treatments; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Early diagnosis and tailored interventions and
- 4 therapies help improve quality of life for individuals with
- 5 Angelman Syndrome; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate
- 7 February 15, 2014, as "Angelman Syndrome Awareness Day" in
- 8 Pennsylvania.
