Designating Spanish as the official language of the Commonwealth 1 of Pennsylvania and urging its use in all official acts of 2 State and local government. 3 4 WHEREAS, In 1565, Spanish explorers established the first permanent settlement in what is now the United States, called 5 Saint Augustine, in what is today known as the state of Florida; 6 7 anđ 8 WHEREAS, Early Spanish explorations and settlements in North America, including the Spanish language of those early settlers, 9 laid the landscape for the formation of what we know today as 10 11 the United States of America; and 12 WHEREAS, Latinos are the largest minority ethnic group in the 13 United States today, with more than 810,000 residing in 14 Pennsylvania; and 15 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth has been further enriched by the waves of immigrants that it has both received and welcomed, 16 particularly by those of Hispanic descent; and 17 WHEREAS, Innumerable individuals of Hispanic descent have 18

1 made many great and noteworthy contributions to this 2 Commonwealth in all fields of interest, including medicine, the military, politics, aeronautics, academia, labor and industry, 3 4 business, sports and the arts and entertainment; and 5 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's Hispanic population has served as a foundation to this Commonwealth's economy and continues to play 6 7 an integral role in the cultural diversity of our State; and WHEREAS, The U.S. Census Bureau projects that the country's 8 9 Hispanic population will reach 132.8 million by July 1, 2050, 10 which will constitute 30% of the overall population of the 11 United States; and

12 WHEREAS, In an effort to communicate with the citizens of 13 this Commonwealth, Pennsylvania must be forward thinking and 14 preemptive in addressing and embracing both an impending local 15 and national demographic transformation; and

16 WHEREAS, Designating Spanish as the official language of the 17 Commonwealth serves the overall interests of our government and 18 its citizens by bridging unnecessary cultural and language gaps; 19 therefore be it

20 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate Spanish 21 as the official language of the Commonwealth, and urge its use 22 in all official acts of State and local governments.
