A RESOLUTION

Urging the Congress of the United States to designate Spanish as 1 the official language of the United States and to mandate its 2 use in all official acts of the Federal Government. З WHEREAS, Since the adoption of the Declaration of 4 5 Independence on July 4, 1776, and the founding of the United States of America, regrettably our great nation has been devoid 6 of an official and unifying language; and 7 WHEREAS, More than 90% of the world's nations, excluding the 8 United States of America, have formally adopted an official 9 10 language; and 11 WHEREAS, In 1565, it was Spanish explorers that established the first permanent settlement, called Saint Augustine, in what 12 is today known as the State of Florida; and 13 14 WHEREAS, It was these early Spaniard explorations and 15 settlements upon the North American continent, including the 16 Spanish language of these early settlers, that laid the 17 landscape for the formation of what we know today as the United 18 States of America; and

WHEREAS, To further underscore the impact of the Spanish 1 language in the United States, there are well over 2,000 cities 2 and towns, dozens of mountains and rivers and several states 3 that possess names derived from the Spanish language; and 4 WHEREAS, More importantly, there are countless intrepid souls 5 of Hispanic descent such as General Benardo de Galvez and the 6 first Admiral of the United States Navy, Admiral David Glasgow 7 Farragut, who played an instrumental role in the critical 8 military affairs which ultimately led to our nation's much 9 celebrated independence; and 10

WHEREAS, The United States of America has been further enriched by the waves of immigrants that it has both received and welcomed upon its shores, particularly by those of Hispanic descent; and

15 WHEREAS, Innumerable individuals of Hispanic descent have made many great and noteworthy contributions to the United 16 States in all fields of interest, including the fields of 17 18 medicine, military, politics, aeronautics, academia, labor and industry, business, sports, the arts and entertainment; and 19 20 WHEREAS, In September 1968, Congress authorized President 21 Lyndon B. Johnson to proclaim the week, including September 15 and 16, as "National Hispanic Heritage Week" in recognition of 22 23 the many important contributions made by citizens of Hispanic 24 descent, as well as Latin-American independence; and 25 WHEREAS, On August 17, 1988, under President Ronald Reagan, the observance of "Hispanic Heritage Week" was expanded to a 26 month-long celebration, "National Hispanic Heritage Month," 27 observed annually from September 15 through October 15; and 28 29 WHEREAS, Historically the United States' Hispanic population 30 has served as a foundation to the nation's economy and continues

to play an integral role in the cultural diversity of our
nation; and

3 WHEREAS, According to the United States Census Bureau, it is 4 estimated that the Latino population comprises 50.5 million of 5 the total population of the United States; and

6 WHEREAS, The United States Census Bureau also projects that 7 the nation's Hispanic population will reach 132.8 million by 8 July 1, 2050, which will constitute 30% of the overall 9 population of the United States; and

WHEREAS, According to the Central Intelligence Agency, there are more than 336 million people globally who speak Spanish as their first language; and

WHEREAS, The prevalence of the Spanish language and the percentage of first language Spanish speaking persons is only second in the world to that of the Mandarin language and first language Mandarin speaking persons; and

WHEREAS, In an ever expanding global economy, the United States' ability to communicate with the citizens and governments of Spanish speaking countries is critical to preserving our status as a world leader and maintaining our perch upon the pinnacle of the global stage; and

22 WHEREAS, The United States must be forward thinking and 23 preemptive in addressing and embracing both an impending 24 domestic and global demographic transformation; and

WHEREAS, Proclaiming Spanish as the official language of the United States serves the overall interests of the United States Government and its citizens by bridging unnecessary cultural and language gaps; therefore be it

29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the Congress30 of the United States to designate Spanish as the official
