AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto, " further providing for distress in 5 school districts of the first class and for public hearing 6 prior to closing school; and providing for conditions for 7 closing schools. 8

- 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 10 hereby enacts as follows:
- 11 Section 1. Section 696(i)(6) of the act of March 10, 1949
- 12 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
- 13 amended October 30, 2001 (P.L.828, No.83), is amended to read:
- 14 Section 696. Distress in School Districts of the First
- 15 Class.--* * *
- 16 (i) In addition to all powers granted to the superintendent
- 17 by law and a special board of control under section 693 and
- 18 notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the School Reform
- 19 Commission shall have the following powers:
- 20 * * *

- 1 (6) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this act, to
- 2 close or reconstitute a school, including the reassignment,
- 3 suspension or dismissal of professional employes. Provided,
- 4 however, That no school in a school district of the first class
- 5 shall be closed except as provided for in sections 780, 1311 and
- 6 1311.1.
- 7 * * *
- 8 Section 2. Section 780 of the act, added April 4, 1984
- 9 (P.L.190, No.38), is amended to read:
- 10 Section 780. Public Hearing Prior to Closing School. -- In the
- 11 event of a permanent closing of a public school or substantially
- 12 all of a school's facilities, the board of school directors
- 13 shall hold a public hearing on the question not less than three
- 14 (3) months prior to the decision of the board relating to the
- 15 closing of the school. Notwithstanding any provision of this act
- 16 or regulation to the contrary, the board of school directors or
- 17 <u>a special board of control in a school district of the first</u>
- 18 class shall hold a separate hearing for each school that is
- 19 proposed to be permanently closed in the school district and for
- 20 <u>each school designated to receive an increase of thirty percent</u>
- 21 (30%) or more in student enrollment as the result of a school
- 22 being permanently closed. Notice of the hearing shall be given
- 23 in a newspaper of general circulation in the school district at
- 24 least fifteen (15) days prior to the date of such hearings. The
- 25 board of school directors or a special board of control in a
- 26 school district of the first class shall also conspicuously post
- 27 notice of the hearing on the school district's Internet website,
- 28 if a website is maintained. The published and posted notice
- 29 shall contain the date, time, place and purpose of the hearing
- 30 and shall be in English and Spanish.

- 1 Section 3. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 2 <u>Section 1311.1. Conditions for Closing Schools.--(a)</u> In
- 3 determining whether a school shall be permanently closed
- 4 pursuant to section 1311 and the students transferred to another
- 5 school in the school district, the board of school directors of
- 6 <u>a school district or a special board of control exercising the</u>
- 7 authority of a board of school directors in a school district of
- 8 the first class pursuant to section 696 shall:
- 9 (1) Prepare, or cause to be prepared, a thorough study of
- 10 <u>each school proposed to be permanently closed. The study shall</u>
- 11 focus primarily on the welfare of the students to be affected by
- 12 the proposed closure at both the school to be permanently closed
- 13 and the school to which the students will be transferred and
- 14 shall include, but may not be limited to, an evaluation of the
- 15 <u>following:</u>
- 16 (i) Enrollments, including any anticipated increase or
- 17 decrease in student enrollment based on both historical and
- 18 current projections, and the capacity of the school to which the
- 19 students from the school proposed to be closed will be
- 20 transferred to accommodate additional students.
- 21 (ii) A summary of any known or anticipated inconvenience or
- 22 hardship, including safety concerns, walking hazards or
- 23 transportation factors, which may affect the transfer of
- 24 students enrolled in the school proposed to be permanently
- 25 closed to another school in the school district.
- 26 (iii) Any known or projected cost of providing additional
- 27 school facilities.
- 28 <u>(iv) Information on school closure counseling services</u>
- 29 available to students enrolled in each school proposed to be
- 30 permanently closed.

- 1 (v) Information on student enrollment or population
- 2 characteristics such as ethnicity, special needs, free and
- 3 reduced lunch and English language learners.
- 4 (vi) Description and comparison of the learning climate,
- 5 academic performance and special and innovative programming of
- 6 both the school proposed to be permanently closed and the school
- 7 to which the students will be transferred in the school
- 8 district.
- 9 (vii) The physical condition of the school facility of both
- 10 the school proposed to be permanently closed and the school to
- 11 which the students will be transferred in the school district,
- 12 including technological capacity or other educationally
- 13 innovative features.
- 14 (viii) The actual operating costs of the school proposed to
- 15 be permanently closed.
- 16 (ix) A summary of the anticipated financial impact that
- 17 would result from permanently closing the school.
- 18 (x) Information on the proximity of the school proposed to
- 19 be closed to other schools in the school district.
- 20 (xi) A summary of all procedures developed and implemented
- 21 to ensure community involvement and actual community input
- 22 regarding the criteria to be considered in the decision-making
- 23 process by community members representing parents, students,
- 24 social services, civic organizations, neighborhood businesses
- 25 <u>and local and State government officials.</u>
- 26 (xii) A summary of the anticipated disposition of the school
- 27 building, including any plans for the sale or lease of the
- 28 school building, and plans for the ongoing maintenance and
- 29 security of the closed school building.
- 30 (xiii) Any other information or factors the board of school

- 1 directors or special board of control deems relevant.
- 2 (2) Conduct public hearings in accordance with section 780
- 3 for each school which is proposed to be closed in the school
- 4 district as well as for each school designated to receive an
- 5 increase of thirty percent (30%) or more in student enrollment
- 6 <u>as the result of school closures</u>.
- 7 (b) When a board of school directors or a special board of
- 8 control in a school district of the first class finally
- 9 determines that a school will be permanently closed in a school
- 10 <u>district</u>, the following shall apply:
- 11 (1) School closure counseling services shall be provided to
- 12 students enrolled in a school proposed to be permanently closed
- 13 in the school district and may be provided to such students on a
- 14 temporary or as needed basis and shall be provided in accordance
- 15 with the school district's policies and procedures governing
- 16 <u>counseling services</u>.
- 17 (2) School closure counseling services required under this
- 18 subsection shall be made available to all students enrolled in a
- 19 school subject to closure within thirty (30) days of the final
- 20 <u>decision to permanently close the school</u>.
- 21 (3) For the purposes of this subsection, the term "school
- 22 <u>closure counseling services" shall mean group or individual</u>
- 23 counseling provided to students enrolled in a school proposed to
- 24 <u>be permanently closed</u> in order to help such students transition
- 25 <u>emotionally and physically to a new school in the school</u>
- 26 district.
- 27 (c) A board of school directors or a special board of
- 28 control in a school district of the first class may authorize
- 29 the use of school guidance counselors employed by the school
- 30 district or professional counselors licensed in accordance with

- 1 the provisions of the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39),
- 2 known as the "Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and
- 3 Professional Counselors Act, " to provide school closing
- 4 counseling services authorized under this subsection.
- 5 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
