A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the Borough of Paxtang on its 100th anniversary.
- 2 WHEREAS, The Borough of Paxtang takes its name from the
- 3 Susquehannock Indian village of Peshtank, which means "still
- 4 waters"; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In the earliest years of William Penn's charter, the
- 6 area known as Paxtang, sometimes referred to as Paxton,
- 7 encompassed the land from the banks of the Swatara Creek,
- 8 northward to Blue Mountain and beyond; and
- 9 WHEREAS, From 1729 until 1785, the land was a township in
- 10 Lancaster County; and
- 11 WHEREAS, In 1754, much of the land was deeded to Thomas
- 12 Rutherford whose descendants occupied it until F.H. Rohrer and
- 13 Son, a Harrisburg realty company, established a subdivision; and
- 14 WHEREAS, After the founding of Dauphin County, the land was
- 15 divided into many townships, including Swatara Township, which
- 16 included what is now known as the Borough of Paxtang; and
- WHEREAS, The Borough of Paxtang was founded on July 3, 1914,

- 1 and incorporated the same year; and
- WHEREAS, Religion and education have been at Paxtang's
- 3 Scotch-Irish core; and
- WHEREAS, Paxton Church was founded in 1732, making it the
- 5 oldest Presbyterian Church in this Commonwealth; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The borough features a sampling of American domestic
- 7 architecture from the late 19th century and early 20th century,
- 8 with its main thoroughfare, Paxtang Avenue, showcasing high-
- 9 style homes; and
- 10 WHEREAS, On July 3 through 6, 2014, the residents of Paxtang
- 11 are celebrating the 100th anniversary of the borough's founding
- 12 with several community events, including a dinner, parade and
- 13 home and garden tour; therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 15 Borough of Paxtang on its 100th anniversary.
