AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 9, 1976 (P.L.817, No.143), entitled "An 2
- act relating to mental health procedures; providing for the treatment and rights of mentally disabled persons, for 3
- voluntary and involuntary examination and treatment and for 4
- determinations affecting those charged with crime or under 5
- sentence, " further providing for involuntary emergency 6

- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8

- 10 Section 1. Section 302(c) of the act of July 9, 1976
- (P.L.817, No.143), known as the Mental Health Procedures Act, is 11
- amended and the section is amended by adding a subsection to 12

- 14 Section 302. Involuntary Emergency Examination and Treatment
- Authorized by a Physician Not to Exceed One Hundred Twenty 15
- Hours. --* * * 16
- (c) Notification of Rights at Emergency Examination. -- Upon 17
- arrival at the facility, the person shall be informed of the 18
- reasons for emergency examination and of his right to 19
- communicate immediately with others. He shall be given 20

- 1 reasonable use of the telephone. He shall be requested to
- 2 furnish the names of parties whom he may want notified of his
- 3 custody and kept informed of his status. The county
- 4 administrator or the director of the facility shall:
- 5 (1) give notice to such parties of the whereabouts and
- 6 status of the person, how and when he may be contacted and
- 7 visited, and how they may obtain information concerning him
- 8 while he is in inpatient treatment; [and]
- 9 (1.1) notwithstanding section 111, inform the person's next
- 10 of kin that his relative has entered the facility for emergency
- 11 evaluation and treatment; and
- 12 (2) take reasonable steps to assure that while the person is
- 13 detained, the health and safety needs of any of his dependents
- 14 are met, and that his personal property and the premises he
- 15 occupies are secure.
- 16 * * *
- (e) Definition. -- As used in this section, the term "next of
- 18 kin" means the spouse and relatives by blood, including, but not
- 19 limited to, parents and quardians, as long as the person is an
- 20 <u>adult or an emancipated minor</u>.
- 21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
