AN ACT

Amending the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), 1 entitled "An act relating to the regulation of the practice 2 of pharmacy, including the sales, use and distribution of 3 drugs and devices at retail; and amending, revising, 4 consolidating and repealing certain laws relating thereto," 5 further providing for the authority to administer injectable 6 medications, biologicals and immunizations.

- hereby enacts as follows: 9

- 10 Section 9.2 of the act of September 27, 1961
- 11 (P.L.1700, No.699), known as the Pharmacy Act, added June 29,
- 12 2002 (P.L.673, No.102), is amended to read:
- Section 9.2. Authority to Administer Injectable Medications, 13
- 14 Biologicals and Immunizations.--(a) [Within eighteen months
- from the effective date of this section, the] The board shall by 15
- 16 regulation establish education and training standards and
- 17 practice guidelines pursuant to which pharmacists shall be
- 18 authorized to administer injectable medications, biologicals and
- 19 immunizations to persons who are more than eighteen years of age
- 20 and influenza immunizations by injectable or needle-free

- 1 (6) Maintenance of a level of professional liability
- 2 <u>insurance coverage in the minimum amount of one million dollars</u>
- 3 (\$1,000,000) per occurrence or claims made. Failure to maintain
- 4 insurance coverage as required shall subject the licensees to
- 5 disciplinary proceedings. The board shall accept as satisfactory
- 6 evidence of insurance coverage any of the following:
- 7 (i) personally purchased liability insurance;
- 8 (ii) professional liability insurance coverage provided by
- 9 the individual licensee's employer; or
- 10 (iii) similar insurance coverage acceptable to the board.
- 11 (7) Notification of the individual's primary care provider,
- 12 <u>if known</u>, within seventy-two hours of administration.
- 13 (b) A pharmacist's authority to administer injectable
- 14 medications, biologicals and immunizations shall not be
- 15 delegated to any other person. A pharmacy intern who has
- 16 completed a course of education and training which meets the
- 17 requirements of subsection (a) (1) and (2) may administer
- 18 injectable medications, biologicals and immunizations to persons
- 19 who are more than eighteen years of age and influenza
- 20 immunizations by injectable or needle-free delivery methods to
- 21 persons seven years of age and older only under the direct,
- 22 immediate and personal supervision of a pharmacist holding the
- 23 authority to administer injectable medications, biologicals and
- 24 immunizations.
- 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
