

AN ACT

Amending the act of August 9, 1955 (P.L.323, No.130), entitled, 1 as amended, "An act relating to counties of the first, third, 2 fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth classes; amending, 3 revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating 4 thereto; relating to imposition of excise taxes by counties, 5 including authorizing imposition of an excise tax on the 6 rental of motor vehicles by counties of the first class; and 7 providing for regional renaissance initiatives, " in special 8 powers and duties of counties, providing for county humane 9 officers. 10

- 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 12 hereby enacts as follows:
- 13 Section 1. Article XIX of the act of August 9, 1955
- 14 (P.L.323, No.130), known as The County Code, is amended by
- 15 adding a subdivision to read:
- 16 (z.3) Other Powers and Duties
- 17 Section 1999j. County Humane Officers. -- The county
- 18 commissioners may employ a county humane officer who shall be
- 19 authorized to enforce dog control as defined in the act of
- 20 December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225), known as the Dog Law, and
- 21 animal cruelty laws of this Commonwealth as contained in 18
- 22 Pa.C.S. § 5511 (relating to cruelty to animals). In order to be

- 1 eligible for employment as a county humane officer, an
- 2 <u>individual must meet the training requirements contained in 22</u>
- 3 Pa.C.S. §§ 3712 (relating to training program) and 3713
- 4 (relating to continuing education program).
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
