AN ACT

Amending the act of January 14, 1952 (1951 P.L.1898, No.522), 1 entitled, as amended, "An act to provide for the better 2 protection of life and health of the citizens of this 3 Commonwealth by requiring and regulating the examination, 4 licensure and registration of persons and registration of 5 corporations engaging in the care, preparation and 6 disposition of the bodies of deceased persons, and providing 7 penalties; providing for a State Board of Funeral Directors in the Department of State, and repealing other laws," 8 9 further providing for conduct of business by individuals and 10 partnerships. 11

- 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 13 hereby enacts as follows:
- 14 Section 1. Section 8(a) of the act of January 14, 1952 (1951
- 15 P.L.1898, No.522), known as the Funeral Director Law, amended
- 16 December 19, 1980 (P.L.1329, No.242), is amended to read:
- 17 Section 8. Conduct of Business. -- (a) Individuals and
- 18 Partnerships. Except as provided for in subsection (e) hereof,
- 19 only one license shall be granted to or held by an individual,
- 20 but two or more licensed funeral directors may operate a joint
- 21 or partnership business at one place only. No funeral practice,
- 22 whether conducted by an individual or a partnership, may be

- 1 conducted under any other name than the name or last name of the
- 2 individual or, if a partnership, the names or last names of all
- 3 partners: Provided, however, That an individual or partnership
- 4 may be conducted under the name of a predecessor funeral
- 5 establishment if the name or names of the owner or partners
- 6 appear as operator or operators on all signs, forms and
- 7 advertising. No person not licensed under this act shall have
- 8 any interest in the practice carried on by a licensed funeral
- 9 director except as otherwise herein provided. Upon the death of
- 10 a licensee, the board shall issue a license and renewal thereof
- 11 to his estate, only for a period not exceeding three (3) years,
- 12 or widows or widowers of deceased licensees without time
- 13 limitations, [as long as they remain unmarried,] providing the
- 14 widow, or widower, the executor or administrator of the estate
- 15 of the deceased licensee's heir or heirs, informs the board, of
- 16 the intent to continue practice, within ten (10) days and
- 17 applies within thirty (30) days for a certificate of licensure.
- 18 Such notice shall be in writing. The practice carried on by a
- 19 licensee's estate, widow or widower shall be under the
- 20 supervision of a licensed funeral director employed on a full
- 21 time basis. A licensee's estate, widow or widower shall not be
- 22 denied a license because the deceased licensee operated a
- 23 business in partnership with one or more other licensed funeral
- 24 directors nor shall a widow or widower be denied the right to
- 25 enter into a partnership with one or more of the licensed
- 26 funeral directors with whom the deceased licensee was in
- 27 partnership.

- 29 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
