

AN ACT

1 Providing for the notice of approval of collective bargaining
2 agreements.

3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4 hereby enacts as follows:

5 Section 1. Short title.

6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Commonwealth
7 Collective Bargaining Notification Act.

8 Section 2. Definitions.

9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
11 context clearly indicates otherwise:

12 "Employer representative." The Secretary of Administration
13 or a designee of the Office of Administration.

14 Section 3. Notice prior to approval of collective bargaining
15 agreement.

16 (a) Notice.--An employer representative shall provide notice
17 prior to the signature approval of a proposed collective

1 bargaining agreement between the Commonwealth and a public labor
2 union. The notice required under this section shall:

3 (1) Be posted on the employer representative's publicly
4 accessible Internet website at least two weeks prior to the
5 employer representative's approval of the proposed collective
6 bargaining agreement and shall remain at least 30 days
7 following the approval of the collective bargaining
8 agreement.

9 (2) Include the following:

10 (i) a statement of the proposed terms of the
11 collective bargaining agreement; and

12 (ii) an estimate of the costs to the public employer
13 associated with the proposed collective bargaining
14 agreement.

15 (b) Requirements.--The notice requirements of this section
16 shall not apply to section 805 of the act of July 23, 1970
17 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the Public Employe Relations Act,
18 and section 7(a) of the act of June 24, 1968 (P.L.237, No.111),
19 referred to as the Policemen and Firemen Collective Bargaining
20 Act.

21 (c) Regulations.--The Office of Administration shall
22 promulgate regulations pursuant to the act of June 25, 1982
23 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the Regulatory Review Act, to set
24 forth the form of the notice required under subsection (a).
25 Section 4. Effective date.

26 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
