## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
- Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in organization of
- appellate courts, providing for the commerce division of the
- 4 Superior Court.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 Section 541.1. Commerce division.
- 10 (a) Establishment.--The commerce division is established in
- 11 the Superior Court.
- 12 (b) Composition. -- The division shall consist of judges
- 13 appointed by the President Judge of the Superior Court,
- 14 <u>including no more than three senior judges</u>:
- 15 (c) Status of the commerce division. -- The commerce division
- 16 of the Superior Court is an administrative unit composed of
- 17 those judges of the court responsible for the transaction of
- 18 specified classes of the business of the court.
- 19 <u>(d) Jurisdiction.--</u>

7	(1) The following types of appeals under the
2	jurisdiction of the Superior Court pursuant to section 742
3	(relating to appeals from courts of common pleas) shall be
4	heard by the commerce division:
5	(i) Actions relating to the internal affairs,
6	governance, dissolution, liquidation, rights or
7	obligations between or among owners and liability or
8	indemnity of managers of corporations, partnerships,
9	limited partnerships, limited liability partnerships,
10	professional associations, business trusts, joint
11	ventures or other business enterprises, including any
12	actions involving the interpretation of the rights or
13	obligations under the organic law, articles of
14	incorporation, by-laws or agreements governing such
15	enterprises.
16	(ii) Disputes between or among two or more business
17	enterprises relating to a transaction, business
18	relationship or a contract. An appeal under the
19	jurisdiction of the commerce division pursuant to this
20	paragraph may include an individual named as a party so
21	long as the dispute is not prohibited under paragraph
22	<u>(2).</u>
23	(2) The following types of appeals shall not be heard by
24	the commerce division:
25	(i) Personal injury, survival or wrongful death
26	matters.
27	(ii) Individual consumer claims against businesses
28	or insurers, including products liability and personal
29	injury cases.
30	(iii) Matters involving occupational health or

- 2 <u>(iv) Environmental claims not involved in the sale</u>
- 3 or disposition of a business.
- 4 (v) Matters of eminent domain.
- 5 (vi) Malpractice claims, other than those brought by
- 6 <u>business enterprises against attorneys, accountants,</u>
- 7 <u>architects or other professionals in connection with the</u>
- 8 rendering of professional services to the business
- 9 <u>enterprise</u>.
- 10 (vii) Employment law cases, except those that the
- President Judge deems are commercial in nature.
- 12 <u>(viii) Individual residential real estate and</u>
- 13 <u>noncommercial landlord-tenant disputes.</u>
- 14 <u>(ix) Domestic relations matters, including actions</u>
- related to distribution of marital property, custody or
- 16 support.
- 17 Section 2. Section 542 of Title 42 is amended to read:
- 18 § 542. Powers of Superior Court.
- 19 The Superior Court and its divisions shall have all powers
- 20 necessary or appropriate in aid of its jurisdiction which are
- 21 agreeable to the usages and principles of law.
- 22 Section 3. Title 42 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 23 § 728. Appeals from the commerce division of the Superior
- 24 <u>Court</u>.
- 25 The Supreme Court shall have exclusive jurisdiction of
- 26 appeals from orders of the commerce division of the Superior
- 27 Court.
- 28 Section 4. Section 951 of Title 42 is amended by adding a
- 29 subsection to read:
- 30 § 951. Court Divisions.

- 2 (c.1) Commerce division. -- Any court of common pleas may
- 3 establish a commerce court division.

- 5 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
