5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Title 53 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
9	§ 2167.1. Motorcycle profiling prohibited.
10	(a) General ruleNo police officer or police department
11	may engage in motorcycle profiling in this Commonwealth.
12	(b) Duty of commissionThe commission shall include, as
13	part of the basic and in-service training required by this
14	subchapter, instruction on what conduct constitutes motorcycle
15	profiling in patrol procedures and other police department
16	operations and the duty to refrain from engaging in motorcycle
17	profiling.
18	(c) Duty of police departmentsA police department shall

1	include in its patrol procedures and operations policies a
2	statement that condemns motorcycle profiling.
3	(d) Private right of action establishedA victim of
4	motorcycle profiling may bring a private right of action in a
5	court of competent jurisdiction against any police officer or
6	police department that engages in motorcycle profiling in
7	violation of this section. In the action, the victim may be
8	awarded injunctive relief, actual damages, punitive damages and
9	reasonable attorney fees and costs.
10	(e) For purposes of this section, "motorcycle profiling"
11	means the use of the fact that an individual rides a motorcycle
