

## AN ACT

1 Amending the act of July 2, 1935 (P.L.589, No.210), entitled,  
2 "An act to safeguard human health and life by providing for  
3 the issuance of permits to, and regulation of persons and  
4 entities selling milk and milk products; conferring powers,  
5 and imposing duties on the Secretary of Agriculture; and  
6 otherwise providing for the administration of the act; and  
7 imposing penalties," providing for information on pasteurized  
8 milk.

9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
10 hereby enacts as follows:

11 Section 1. The act of July 2, 1935 (P.L.589, No.210),  
12 referred to as the Milk Sanitation Law, is amended by adding a  
13 section to read:

14 Section 7.1. In counties of the sixth class, the following  
15 information shall not be required to be provided on any label,  
16 cap or nonglass container of pasteurized milk sold or offered  
17 for retail sale on the same premises that processes not more  
18 than one thousand two hundred (1,200) gallons of milk per week:

19 (1) A lot number.

20 (2) A manufacturing date code.

21 (3) A recommended date by which a consumer may safely

1 consume milk.

2 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
