AN ACT

Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled, as 1 reenacted and amended, "An act concerning townships of the 2 second class; and amending, revising, consolidating and changing the law relating thereto, " in auditors and 3 4 accountants, further providing for auditor's compensation. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. Section 902 of the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), known as The Second Class Township Code, amended June 9 22, 1999 (P.L.114. No.17), is amended to read: 10 11 Section 902. Auditor's Compensation.-- (a) Each auditor shall receive [ten dollars (\$10)] a base amount of fifteen 12 13 dollars (\$15), subject to adjustment under subsection (d), for each hour necessarily employed in the duties of the office upon 14 15 presentation to the board of supervisors of an itemized listing of the dates, times, places and hours worked to perform the 16 17 audit. No auditor in a township having a population of ten thousand or less is entitled to receive a base amount of more 18 19 than [one thousand dollars (\$1,000)] one thousand five hundred 1 dollars (\$1,500), subject to adjustment under subsection (d),
2 for completing the annual audit, settlement and adjustment. No
3 auditor in a township having a population in excess of ten
4 thousand is entitled to receive <u>a base amount of more than [two</u>
5 thousand dollars (\$2,000)] <u>three thousand dollars (\$3,000)</u>,
6 <u>subject to adjustment under subsection (d)</u>, for completing the
7 annual audit, settlement and adjustment.

In addition to the time actually used by the board of 8 (b) 9 auditors to complete the audit, settlement and adjustment, each auditor may be compensated by a base amount at the rate of [ten 10 dollars (\$10)] <u>fifteen dollars (\$15), subject to adjustment</u> 11 under subsection (d), each hour for not more than fifty hours to 12 audit the accounts of any public official who handles public 13 14 funds when a vacancy occurs in the office of the public official. 15

(c) Each auditor shall be reimbursed for travel costs incurred in the performance of the auditing duties at the rate established by the board of supervisors under the act of July 20, 1979 (P.L.156, No.51), referred to as the Uniform Mileage Fee Law, and for other expenses, including postage, notary fees or publication costs, incurred during the audit.

22 (d) Adjustments to the base amounts specified under

23 <u>subsections (a) and (b) shall be made as follows:</u>

24 (1) The board of supervisors shall consult the Consumer

25 Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for the

26 Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland area as

27 published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of

28 Labor Statistics, for the twelve-month period ending December

29 31, 2016, and for each successive twelve-month period

30 <u>thereafter.</u>

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1	(2) If the board of supervisors determines that there is no
2	positive percentage change, there shall be no adjustment to the
3	base amounts for the following calendar year.
4	(3) If the board of supervisors determines that there has
5	been an increase in the CPI-U, then the board of supervisors
6	shall adjust the auditor's compensation to the nearest dollar
7	amount and pass a resolution detailing auditor's compensation
8	for the following calendar year.
9	(4) The determinations and adjustments required under this
10	subsection shall be made in the period between October 1 and
11	November 15 of the year following the effective date of this
12	subsection and annually between October 1 and November 15 of
13	each year thereafter.
14	(5) Any adjustments determined by the board of supervisors
15	shall take effect on January 1 of the following calendar year.

16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
