## A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of September 2016 as "Hunger Action Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, September 2016 has been designated as "Hunger Action
- 4 Month" to provide a unified opportunity for communities in the
- 5 United States to focus attention on the persistent problem of
- 6 domestic hunger and to mobilize a movement to end hunger in
- 7 America; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The United States Department of Agriculture gathers
- 9 information and provides statistics related to domestic hunger;
- 10 and
- 11 WHEREAS, In 2014, according to the United States Department
- 12 of Agriculture, 14% of United States households, including
- 13 approximately 718,000 Pennsylvania households, were food
- 14 insecure; and
- WHEREAS, In 2014, according to a study published by Feeding
- 16 America, 1,760,450 Pennsylvanians, including 521,750 children,
- 17 did not always know where they would find their next meal; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Hunger is a reality for approximately 14% of the
- 2 population in Pennsylvania, or nearly one in seven
- 3 Pennsylvanians; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Many United States households experience hunger, and
- 5 some people in these households frequently skip meals or eat too
- 6 little, sometimes going without food for a whole day; and
- WHEREAS, Research shows that preschool and school-age
- 8 children who experience severe hunger have higher levels of
- 9 chronic illness, anxiety, depression and behavioral problems
- 10 than children receiving a well-balanced diet; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Food-insecure seniors have lower nutrient intakes
- 12 than food-secure seniors, and without proper nutrients, seniors
- 13 are at increased risk of disability, deteriorating physical and
- 14 mental health, decreased resistance to infections, lengthened
- 15 hospital stays and being underweight; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The costs of other essentials, such as home heating,
- 17 gasoline, housing and medical care, have increased
- 18 significantly, and for families caught in the squeeze between
- 19 declining wages and rising costs, the food budget becomes a
- 20 frequent pressure point; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Utilization of emergency food assistance becomes a
- 22 way for these families to keep food on the table while still
- 23 paying the bills; and
- 24 WHEREAS, In 2014, according to the United States Department
- 25 of Agriculture, approximately 5.5% of all United States
- 26 households accessed emergency food from a food pantry at least
- 27 once; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Individuals, charities, businesses and government
- 29 all have a role to play in getting food to those in need; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Food banks, food rescue organizations, soup

- 1 kitchens, food pantries, faith-based organizations, businesses
  - 2 and individuals are donating time, raising funds and giving food
  - 3 to help their neighbors; and
  - 4 WHEREAS, Individuals benefiting from the availability of
  - 5 donated food range from infants and toddlers, school-age
  - 6 children and adolescents to single mothers, single fathers, two-
  - 7 parent families, veterans and their families and seniors;
  - 8 therefore be it
  - 9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
  - 10 month of September 2016 as "Hunger Action Month" in
  - 11 Pennsylvania.
