- Observing September 2016 as "Newborn Screening Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Newborn screening is the practice of screening every
- 4 baby born prior to hospital discharge for certain harmful or
- 5 potentially fatal conditions that are not otherwise apparent at
- 6 birth; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Early detection of these conditions in newborns
- 8 facilitates timely interventions that result in significant
- 9 decreases in morbidity, mortality and disability; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Newborn screening is a comprehensive system that
- 11 includes testing, diagnosis, follow-up, treatment, education and
- 12 evaluation; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Every year more than 4 million newborns in the
- 14 United States and more than 140,000 newborns in Pennsylvania
- 15 undergo newborn screening; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Newborn screening was recently named in the Centers
- 17 for Disease Control and Prevention's publication entitled, "Ten

- 1 Great Public Health Achievements in the 20th Century"; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Newborn screening began in 1963 in the United States
- 3 with testing for phenylketonuria (PKU); and
- 4 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania began newborn screening with the act of
- 5 September 9, 1965 (P.L.497, No.251), known as the Newborn Child
- 6 Testing Act, by requiring physicians, hospitals and other
- 7 institutions to administer or cause to be administered tests for
- 8 PKU and other metabolic diseases upon infants in certain cases;
- 9 and
- 10 WHEREAS, Since first enacted in 1965, the newborn screening
- 11 act has been amended three times, most recently with Act 148 of
- 12 2014, which expanded the list of required diseases for testing
- 13 from six to twelve; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In addition to the required testing, Pennsylvania
- 15 provides newborn hearing screening, testing for critical
- 16 congenital heart disease and follow-up screening and services
- 17 for other diseases; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth's Newborn Screening and Follow-up
- 19 Program is administered by the Pennsylvania Department of
- 20 Health; and
- 21 WHEREAS, "Newborn Screening Awareness Month" was started in
- 22 2000 by the Save Babies Through Screening Foundation, along with
- 23 several partner organizations to shine a national spotlight on
- 24 newborn screening and its detectable diseases; therefore be it
- 25 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives observe September
- 26 2016 as "Newborn Screening Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania; and
- 27 be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the Commonwealth officially recognize the
- 29 importance of awareness and encourage parents and future parents
- 30 to educate themselves on newborn screening and take the

1 necessary steps to ensure the health of their children.
