A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 Proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the
- 2 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for
- Governor's budgets and financial plan, for appropriations and
- 4 for surplus.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby resolves as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The following integrated amendments to the
- 8 Constitution of Pennsylvania are proposed in accordance with
- 9 Article XI:
- 10 (1) That section 12 of Article VIII be amended to read:
- 11 § 12. Governor's budgets [and financial plan], financial plan,
- 12 cost savings plan and performance criteria.
- Annually, at the times set by law, the Governor shall submit
- 14 to the General Assembly:
- 15 (a) A balanced operating budget for the ensuing fiscal year,
- 16 abiding by the provisions contained within sections 13 and 14 of
- 17 <u>Article VIII</u>, setting forth in detail (i) proposed expenditures

- 1 classified by department or agency and by program and (ii)
- 2 estimated revenues from all sources. If estimated revenues and
- 3 available surplus are less than proposed expenditures, the
- 4 Governor shall recommend specific additional sources of revenue
- 5 sufficient to pay the deficiency and the estimated revenue to be
- 6 derived from each source;
- 7 (b) A capital budget for the ensuing fiscal year setting
- 8 forth in detail proposed expenditures to be financed from the
- 9 proceeds of obligations of the Commonwealth or of its agencies
- 10 or authorities or from operating funds; and
- 11 (c) A financial plan for not less than the next succeeding
- 12 five fiscal years, which plan shall include for each such fiscal
- 13 year:
- 14 (i) Projected operating expenditures classified by
- 15 department or agency and by program, in reasonable detail, and
- 16 estimated revenues, by major categories, from existing and
- 17 additional sources, and
- 18 (ii) Projected expenditures for capital projects
- 19 specifically itemized by purpose, and the proposed sources of
- 20 financing each.
- 21 (d) A reasonably detailed plan for cost savings, innovation
- 22 and efficiencies for each State agency which includes a list of
- 23 <u>specific expenditures for which savings to the Commonwealth are</u>
- 24 <u>identified</u>.
- 25 (e) A reasonably detailed projection of supplemental
- 26 appropriations for the current year which shall be updated by
- 27 <u>June 1.</u>
- 28 <u>(f) Reasonably detailed performance criteria for each State</u>
- 29 program.
- 30 (2) That section 13 of Article VIII be amended to read:

- 1 § 13. [Appropriations] Balanced budget and State
- 2 <u>appropriations</u>.
- 3 (a) Operating budget appropriations made by the General
- 4 Assembly shall not exceed the actual and estimated revenues and
- 5 surplus available in the same fiscal year.
- 6 (b) The enacted budget shall appropriate money for the
- 7 <u>Commonwealth's pensions in the amount necessary to fund the</u>
- 8 <u>actuarially required contributions of all such pension funds</u>
- 9 <u>during the budget period</u>.
- 10 <u>(c)</u> The General Assembly shall adopt a capital budget for
- 11 the ensuing fiscal year.
- 12 (d) The Governor shall not sign or allow budget
- 13 appropriations to become law if the total appropriations exceed
- 14 the certified revenues for the same fiscal year.
- 15 (e) The State Treasurer shall deny any payments which exceed
- 16 enacted appropriations. If a payment is submitted and the
- 17 payment exceeds enacted appropriations, the treasurer shall
- 18 provide written notification to the General Assembly.
- 19 (3) That section 14 of Article VIII be amended to read:
- 20 § 14. [Surplus] Financial transparency and accountability.
- 21 (a) All surplus of operating funds at the end of the fiscal
- 22 year shall be appropriated during the ensuing fiscal year by the
- 23 General Assembly.
- 24 (b) By June 1 of each year, the Governor shall provide the
- 25 General Assembly with a detailed report on all potential
- 26 unexpended appropriations. At the end of the fiscal year, all
- 27 unexpended appropriations shall be placed into a restricted
- 28 account and appropriated during the ensuing fiscal year by the
- 29 <u>General Assembly.</u>
- 30 (c) By May 15 of each year, the Governor shall provide the

- 1 General Assembly a detailed report of specific appropriations of
- 2 the current fiscal year which may need to be carried over to the
- 3 <u>ensuing fiscal year. The carryover may not exceed October 31 of</u>
- 4 the ensuing fiscal year.
- 5 (d) Any cost savings created by the executive branch shall
- 6 <u>be placed in a restricted account as the savings occur and</u>
- 7 appropriated during the current or ensuing fiscal year by the
- 8 <u>General Assembly.</u>
- 9 (e) Any State funds recovered through litigation shall be
- 10 placed in a restricted account and appropriated by the General
- 11 Assembly.
- 12 <u>(f) Any funds returned to the Commonwealth shall be placed</u>
- 13 in a restricted account and appropriated by the General
- 14 Assembly.
- 15 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General
- 16 Assembly of these proposed constitutional amendments, the
- 17 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to
- 18 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article
- 19 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the
- 20 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in
- 21 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after
- 22 passage of these proposed constitutional amendments.
- 23 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of these
- 24 proposed constitutional amendments, the Secretary of the
- 25 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the
- 26 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the
- 27 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required
- 28 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such
- 29 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of
- 30 these proposed constitutional amendments. The Secretary of the

- 1 Commonwealth shall submit the proposed constitutional amendments
- 2 under section 1 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth
- 3 as a single ballot question at the first primary, general or
- 4 municipal election which meets the requirements of and is in
- 5 conformance with section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution of
- 6 Pennsylvania and which occurs at least three months after the
- 7 proposed constitutional amendments are passed by the General
- 8 Assembly.
