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

## AN ACT

- Amending Title 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania 1
- Consolidated Statutes, providing for Veterans Alternative Punishment Program; and making an appropriation. 2

- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 61 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated

- 5 This chapter authorizes the Veterans Alternative Punishment
- 6 <u>Program.</u>
- 7 § 4002. Declaration of policy (Reserved).
- 8 § 4003. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 10 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Commission." The Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing.
- "Eligible inmate." A veteran sentenced to a term of
- 14 confinement under the jurisdiction of the Department of
- 15 Corrections who is considered eligible under the regulations
- 16 promulgated by the department.
- 17 "Program." The Veterans Alternative Punishment Program which
- 18 shall be referred to as the Pennsylvania Conservation Battalion.
- 19 "Program leader." A veteran who was commissioned during the
- 20 <u>veteran's service.</u>
- 21 "Program staff." A veteran who was not a commissioned
- 22 officer during the veteran's service.
- 23 "Veteran." A resident of this Commonwealth who has served in
- 24 the United States Armed Forces, including a reserve component or
- 25 the National Guard and was discharged or released from the
- 26 <u>service under conditions other than dishonorable.</u>
- 27 § 4004. Veterans Alternative Punishment Program.
- 28 (a) Establishment.--There is established in the department
- 29 the Veterans Alternative Punishment Program which shall be
- 30 referred to as the Pennsylvania Conservation Battalion.

- 1 (b) Scope of program. -- The program shall be phased in in
- 2 accordance with section 4007 (relating to phase-in of program)
- 3 to include 1,500 eligible inmates selected in accordance with
- 4 section 4006 (relating to selection of participants). The 1,500
- 5 eligible inmates shall be in three groups of 500 with each group
- 6 of 500 led by a program leader.
- 7 (c) Voluntary program. -- The program shall be voluntary for
- 8 eligible inmates and no punishment or benefits may be offered in
- 9 <u>exchange for an eliqible inmate's participation or</u>
- 10 nonparticipation. An inmate may apply for the program or the
- 11 program may be offered to an eligible inmate.
- 12 (d) Conditions. -- Applicants may not participate in the
- 13 program unless the applicants agree to be bound by all the terms
- 14 and conditions and sign a memorandum of understanding.
- 15 (e) Qualifications to participate. -- Satisfaction of the
- 16 qualifications set forth in this section and in the regulations
- 17 <u>established by the department to participate does not mean that</u>
- 18 an inmate will automatically be permitted to participate in the
- 19 program.
- 20 (f) Activities. -- The eligible inmates who participate in the
- 21 program will reside outside of the State correctional facility
- 22 and participate in activities including building, constructing,
- 23 <u>maintaining or repairing conservation facilities and trails.</u>
- 24 (g) Expulsion from program. --
- 25 (1) An inmate's participation in the program may be
- 26 <u>suspended or revoked for administrative or disciplinary</u>
- 27 <u>reasons</u>.
- 28 (2) The department shall develop regulations consistent
- 29 with this subsection.
- 30 § 4005. Leaders and staff of program.

- Each group of 500 eligible inmates shall be organized into 1 four companies of 125 eligible inmates who are admitted into the 2 program and shall be led by a program leader and staff, who will 3 be hired by the department from qualified applicants. Each 4 leader and all staff members shall be required to do the 5 6 following: 7 (1) Attend a training program designed by the department. The training program shall be at minimum a four-8 9 week intensive program. (2) Conduct the program within the guidelines and 10 regulations established by the department and commission. 11 § 4006. Selection of participants. 12 13 (a) Primary candidates .-- The primary eligible inmates for the program shall be veteran inmates serving an individual or 14 aggregate minimum sentence of confinement in a State 15 16 correctional facility. (b) Assessment. -- Prior to being selected for the program, an 17 inmate must undergo an assessment performed by the department. 18 19 (c) Ineligibility .-- In addition to any other conditions imposed as part of the selection process, inmates may not: 20 21 (1) Be subject to the deadly weapon-used enhancement 22 under the sentencing guidelines. 23 (2) Have been convicted or adjudicated delinquent of a crime requiring registration under 42 Pa.C.S. Ch. 97 Subch. H 24 25 (relating to registration of sexual offenders). 26 (3) Have a conviction within the past 10 years of any of 27 the following:
- 28 (i) 18 Pa.C.S. § 2502 (relating to murder).
- 29 (ii) 18 Pa.C.S. § 2503 (relating to voluntary
- 30 <u>manslaughter</u>).

3	(iv) 18 Pa.C.S. § 2901(a) (relating to kidnapping).

6	§ 4007. Phase-in of program.
7	(a) First year By June 30, 2018, the department and
8	<pre>commission shall:</pre>
9	(1) Set guidelines and regulations on the program
10	established in this chapter.
11	(2) Create a training program for program leaders and
12	select at least one program leader who has been hired and has
L3	completed all requirements set by the department and
l 4	commission.
L 5	(3) Create a training program for all staff members who
L 6	will be working on the program and have trained the first
L7	group of staff members.
8.	(4) Select a group of 500 eligible inmates who will
.9	participate in the program in lieu of completing prison
20	sentences in a State correctional facility.
21	(5) Implement the program with the first group of 500

23	(b) Second year By June 30, 2019, the department shall:

1 (4) Implement the program for the second group of 500 2 eligible inmates. (c) Third year. -- By June 30, 2020, the department shall: 3 4 (1) Have three program leaders on staff who are fully trained and have completed all requirements set by the 5 6 department and commission. 7 (2) Select a third group of 500 eligible inmates to 8 participate in the program. 9 (3) Implement the program for the third group of 500 10 <u>inmates.</u> § 4008. Completion of program. 11 Upon certification by the department of the inmate's 12 successful completion of the program, the Pennsylvania Board of 13 Probation and Parole shall immediately release the inmate on 14 parole, notwithstanding any minimum sentence imposed in the 15 case. The parolee will be subject to intensive supervision for a 16 period of time determined by the board, after which the parolee 17 will be subject to the usual parole supervision. For all other 18 purposes, the parole of the inmate shall be as provided by 19 Chapter 61 (relating to Pennsylvania Board of Probation and 20 21 Parole). 22 § 4009. Appeals. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to enlarge or 23 limit the right of an inmate to appeal the inmate's sentence. 24 § 4010. Evaluation. 25 The department and the commission shall monitor and evaluate 26 the program to ensure that the programmatic objectives are met. 27 28 § 4011. Appropriation. Each year, the sum of \$6,000,000 shall be transferred to the 29

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department from the General Fund for the purposes of carrying

- 1 out this chapter. In the first year, an additional sum of
- 2 \$4,000,000 shall be transferred to the department from the
- 3 General Fund for equipment, supplies and housing for the
- 4 purposes of carrying out this chapter.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
