## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing June 27, 2017, as "National HIV Testing Day" in
- 2 Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The term HIV stands for human immunodeficiency
- 4 virus, a devastating epidemic that continues to spread in
- 5 communities throughout the United States; and
- 6 WHEREAS, According to the Centers for Disease Control and
- 7 Prevention, more than 1,200,000 people in the United States are
- 8 living with HIV; and
- 9 WHEREAS, In 2015, approximately 40,000 people were diagnosed
- 10 with HIV, which represents an approximate 19% decline in the
- 11 annual number of new diagnoses from 2005 to 2014; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Although much progress has been made in the way of
- 13 HIV prevention, HIV diagnoses have increased among several
- 14 groups; and
- 15 WHEREAS, National statistics highlight that gay and bisexual
- 16 men account for more than 82% of HIV diagnoses and that African-
- 17 American gay and bisexual men account for the largest number of

- 1 HIV diagnoses; and
- WHEREAS, In 2015, youths between 13 and 24 years of age
- 3 accounted for 1 in 5 new HIV diagnoses; and
- WHEREAS, In the midst of the heroin/opioid abuse epidemic
- 5 plaguing our Commonwealth and the United States, it is
- 6 critically important that the medical community and health care
- 7 advocates continue to emphasize that the risk of contracting or
- 8 transmitting HIV increases exponentially with injection drug
- 9 use; and
- WHEREAS, According to the Department of Health, there are
- 11 approximately 35,000 people living with HIV in this
- 12 Commonwealth; and
- WHEREAS, It is estimated that 1 in 8 people living with HIV
- 14 are unaware of their infection; and
- WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's
- 16 guidelines for HIV screening in health care settings recommend
- 17 at least one HIV screening for all individuals between 15 and 65
- 18 years of age, regardless of risk factors; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Thanks to extensive research and extraordinary
- 20 advances in medicine over the last two decades, individuals with
- 21 HIV are now living longer and have an overall better quality of
- 22 life; and
- 23 WHEREAS, With an early diagnosis and a proper treatment
- 24 regimen, individuals living with HIV can lead full and
- 25 productive lives while also taking a proactive role in reducing
- 26 the spread of the virus; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Individuals are more likely to act responsibly and
- 28 protect themselves and other individuals in the community when
- 29 they are aware of their HIV status; and
- 30 WHEREAS, The purpose of this resolution is to foster a

- 1 greater degree of awareness about the subjects of HIV, HIV
- 2 prevention, the importance of learning one's status by getting
- 3 tested and to remove the stigma and widespread misconceptions
- 4 associated with the virus; therefore be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize June
- 6 27, 2017, as "National HIV Testing Day" in Pennsylvania; and be
- 7 it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage all
- 9 Pennsylvanians between 15 and 65 years of age to speak with
- 10 their primary care provider or locate a free and confidential
- 11 HIV testing site to get tested for HIV and to educate themselves
- 12 about the prevention and treatment of HIV.
