



## AN ACT

1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated  
2 Statutes, in licensing of drivers, further providing for  
3 schedule of convictions and points; in rules of the road in  
4 general, prohibiting calls on hand-held mobile telephones;  
5 and imposing a penalty.

6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
7 hereby enacts as follows:

8 Section 1. Section 1535(a) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania  
9 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:

10 § 1535. Schedule of convictions and points.

11 (a) General rule.--A point system for driver education and  
12 control is hereby established which is related to other  
13 provisions for use, suspension and revocation of the operating  
14 privilege as specified under this title. Every driver licensed  
15 in this Commonwealth who is convicted of any of the following  
16 offenses shall be assessed points as of the date of violation in  
17 accordance with the following schedule:

19 Section 2. Title 75 is amended by adding a section to read:

20 § 3317. Prohibiting calls on hand-held mobile telephones.

21 (a) Prohibitions.--

22 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, no  
 23 person shall operate a motor vehicle on a highway or  
 24 trafficway in this Commonwealth while using a hand-held  
 25 mobile telephone to engage in a call while the vehicle is in  
 26 motion.

27 (2) No person under 18 years of age shall use any hand-  
 28 held mobile telephone, including one with a hands-free  
 29 accessory, while operating a moving motor vehicle on a  
 30 highway or trafficway in this Commonwealth.

1 (b) Presumption.--

2 (1) An operator of a motor vehicle who holds a hand-held  
3 mobile telephone to or in the immediate proximity of the  
4 operator's ear while the motor vehicle is in motion is  
5 presumed to be engaging in a call within the meaning of this  
6 section.

7 (2) The presumption established by this subsection is  
8 rebuttable by evidence which shows that the operator was not  
9 engaged in a call.

10 (3) The provisions of this subsection shall not be  
11 construed as authorizing the seizure or forfeiture of a hand-  
12 held mobile telephone or a mobile electronic device, unless  
13 otherwise provided by law.

14 (c) Nonapplicability.--Subsection (a) shall not apply to:

15 (1) The use of a hand-held mobile telephone for the sole  
16 purpose of communicating with any of the following regarding  
17 an emergency situation if the vehicle is not equipped with  
18 hands-free technology:

19 (i) a fire department; or

20 (ii) a police department.

21 (2) Any of the following persons while in the  
22 performance of their official duties and within the scope of  
23 their employment if the vehicle is not equipped with hands-  
24 free technology:

25 (i) a law enforcement officer;

26 (ii) a first responder; or

27 (iii) a member of the armed forces of the United  
28 States while operating a military vehicle.

29 (3) The use of a hand-held radio by a person with an  
30 amateur radio station license issued by the Federal

1 Communications Commission.

2 (4) The use of a hands-free mobile telephone.

3 (d) Penalty.--A person who violates subsection (a) commits a  
4 summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay  
5 a fine of \$50. A person who commits a second or subsequent  
6 offense shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of  
7 \$100.

8 (e) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following  
9 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this  
10 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

11 "Engage in a call." Talking into or listening on a hand-held  
12 mobile telephone. The term does not include holding a hand-held  
13 mobile telephone to activate, deactivate or initiate a function  
14 of the telephone.

15 "Hand-held mobile telephone." A mobile telephone with which  
16 a user engages in a call using at least one hand.

17 "Hands-free accessory." An attachment, add-on, built-in  
18 feature or addition to a mobile telephone, whether or not  
19 permanently installed in a motor vehicle, that when used allows  
20 the vehicle operator to maintain both hands on the steering  
21 wheel.

22 "Hands-free mobile telephone." A hand-held mobile telephone  
23 that has an internal feature or function or that is equipped  
24 with an attachment or addition, whether or not permanently part  
25 of the hand-held mobile telephone, by which a user engages in a  
26 call without the use of either hand, whether or not the use of  
27 either hand is necessary to activate, deactivate or initiate a  
28 function of the telephone.

29 "Immediate proximity." The distance that permits an operator  
30 of a hand-held mobile telephone to hear telecommunications

1 transmitted over the hand-held mobile telephone, but does not  
2 require physical contact with the operator's ear.

3 "Mobile telephone." A cellular, analog, wireless or digital  
4 telephone capable of sending or receiving telephone  
5 communications without an access line for service.

6 "Using" or "use." Holding a hand-held mobile telephone to or  
7 in the immediate proximity of the user's ear.

8 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
