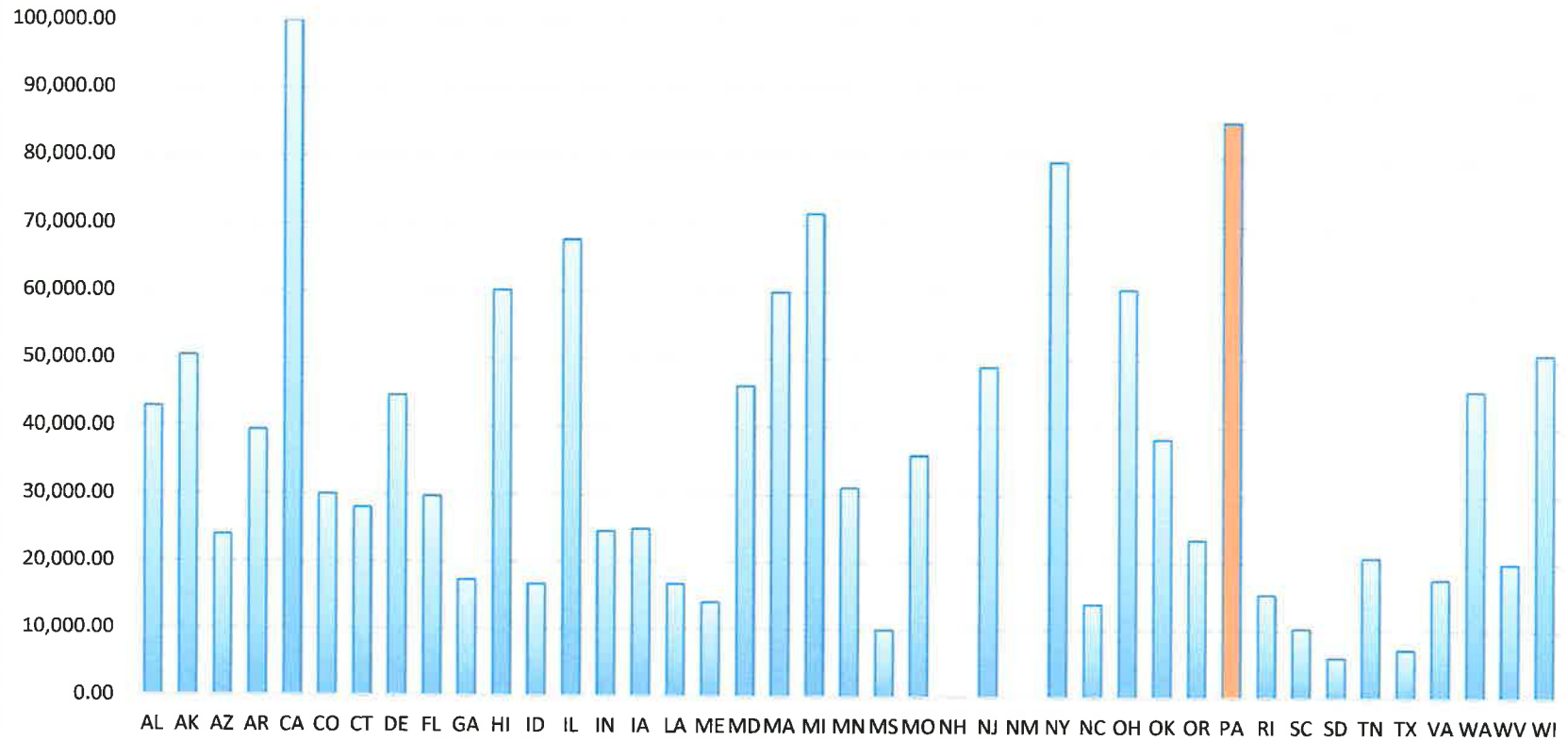

AN ACT

1 Amending the act of September 30, 1983 (P.L.160, No.39),
2 entitled "An act establishing salaries and compensation of
3 certain public officials including justices and judges of
4 Statewide courts, judges of courts of common pleas, judges of
5 the Philadelphia Municipal Court, judges of the Philadelphia
6 Traffic Court, district justices and the Governor, the
7 Lieutenant Governor, the State Treasurer, the Auditor
8 General, the Attorney General and certain other State
9 officers and the salary and certain expenses of the members
10 of the General Assembly; and repealing certain inconsistent
11 acts," further providing for members of the General Assembly.

12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
13 hereby enacts as follows:

14 Section 1. Section 4(d.1) of the act of September 30, 1983
15 (P.L.160, No.39), known as the Public Official Compensation Law,
16 is amended and the section is amended by adding a subsection to
17 read:

18 Section 4. Members of the General Assembly.

19 * * *

20 (a.1) Beginning December 1, 2020, the salary of members of
21 the General Assembly shall be \$25,000 per annum and no health
22 care benefits, retirement benefits, insurance benefits or other

1 employee benefits or compensation, including compensation
2 provided under subsections (a) and (b), shall be allowed, except
3 that actual expenses may be reimbursable to an individual member
4 upon the receipt of documentation of the expense and each member
5 of the General Assembly shall receive an allocation for clerical
6 assistance and other expenses incurred during the member's term
7 in connection with the duties of the member's office. The salary
8 shall be payable in equal monthly installments the first day of
9 the month, including the installment due December 1 of each
10 even-numbered year.

11 * * *

12 (d.1) Subsequent annual cost-of-living adjustment for
13 officers and leaders.--For the 12-month period beginning
14 December 1, 1997, through November 30, 1998, and for each like
15 12-month period [thereafter] through November 30, 2020, the
16 additional compensation of the officers and leaders of the
17 General Assembly shall be increased by an annual cost-of-living
18 adjustment calculated by applying the percentage change in the
19 Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for the
20 Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland area, for the
21 most recent 12-month period for which figures have been
22 officially reported by the United States Department of Labor,
23 Bureau of Labor Statistics immediately prior to the date the
24 adjustment is due to take effect, to the then current
25 compensation. The percentage increase and the new compensation
26 amounts shall be determined jointly by the Chief Clerk of the
27 Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives prior
28 to the annual effective date of the adjustment and shall be
29 published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin within 20 days
30 immediately prior to each cost-of-living increase taking effect.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
