

## AN ACT

1 Amending the act of July 9, 1976 (P.L.817, No.143), entitled "An  
2 act relating to mental health procedures; providing for the  
3 treatment and rights of mentally disabled persons, for  
4 voluntary and involuntary examination and treatment and for  
5 determinations affecting those charged with crime or under  
6 sentence," in general provisions, further providing for  
7 mental health review officer.

8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
9 hereby enacts as follows:

10 Section 1. Section 109(d) of the act of July 9, 1976  
11 (P.L.817, No.143), known as the Mental Health Procedures Act, is  
12 amended to read:

13 Section 109. Mental Health Review Officer.--\* \* \*

14 (d) Notwithstanding any statute to the contrary, judges of  
15 the courts of common pleas, mental health review officers and  
16 county mental health and mental retardation administrators shall  
17 notify the Pennsylvania State Police on a form developed by the  
18 Pennsylvania State Police of the identity of any individual who  
19 has been adjudicated incompetent or who has been involuntarily  
20 committed to a mental institution for inpatient care and

1 treatment under this act or who has been involuntarily treated  
2 as described under 18 Pa.C.S § 6105(c)(4) (relating to persons  
3 not to possess, use, manufacture, control, sell or transfer  
4 firearms). The notification shall be transmitted by the judge,  
5 mental health review officer or county mental health and mental  
6 retardation administrator within [seven days] 72 hours of the  
7 adjudication, commitment or treatment. Notwithstanding any  
8 statute to the contrary, county mental health and mental  
9 retardation administrators shall notify the Pennsylvania State  
10 Police on a form developed by the Pennsylvania State Police of  
11 the identity of any individual who before the effective date of  
12 this act had been adjudicated incompetent or had been  
13 involuntarily committed to a mental institution for inpatient  
14 care treatment under this act or had been involuntarily treated  
15 as described in 18 Pa.C.S. § 6105(c)(4).

16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
