- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. The act of June 24, 1931 (P.L.1206, No.331), 8
- known as The First Class Township Code, is amended by adding a 9
- 10 section to read:
- Section 521. Abolishment of the Office of Elected Auditor .--11
- 12 (a) If the position of elected auditor is vacant, the township
- commissioners may vote by ordinance to abolish the position as 13
- follows: 14
- (1) the township commissioners may enact an ordinance 15
- abolishing the position of elected auditor only after a 16
- municipal election in which the position is not filled; and 17
- 18 (2) upon enactment of the ordinance, the township
- commissioners shall notify the county board of elections to 19

- 1 remove the position of auditor from the ballot for future
- 2 elections.
- 3 (b) At any time after the position of elected auditor is
- 4 abolished, the township commissioners may adopt an ordinance
- 5 reinstating the position of elected auditor. The township
- 6 commissioners must submit to the county board of elections a
- 7 copy of the ordinance. The county board of elections shall add
- 8 the position of auditor to the ballot at the next municipal
- 9 election.
- 10 (c) If the township commissioners eliminate the position of
- 11 elected auditor, the township commissioners shall:
- 12 (1) appoint an independent auditor under the provisions
- of section 520; and
- (2) carry out the duties of the elected auditor under
- section 703 pertaining to setting compensation for township
- 16 commissioners that hold other elected positions. The township
- commissioners may set their own compensation through an
- 18 ordinance that may not take effect until after the next
- municipal election and may not be adjusted again for six
- 20 years.
- 21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
