Amending Title 8 (Boroughs and Incorporated Towns) of the 1 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in elections of officers, 2 providing for abolishment of the office of elected auditor. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5 hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Title 8 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes 7 is amended by adding a section to read: § 807. Abolishment of the office of elected auditor. 8 9 (a) General rule. -- If the position of elected auditor is vacant, the members of council may vote by ordinance to abolish 10 the position as follows: 11 (1) the members of council may enact an ordinance 12 abolishing the position of elected auditor only after a 13 municipal election in which the position is not filled; and 14 (2) upon enactment of the ordinance, the members of 15 16 council shall notify the county board of elections to remove

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(b) Reinstatement. -- At any time after the position of

the position of auditor from the ballot for future elections.

- 1 <u>elected auditor is abolished</u>, the members of council may adopt
- 2 an ordinance reinstating the position of elected auditor. The
- 3 members of council must submit to the county board of elections
- 4 a copy of the ordinance. The county board of elections shall add
- 5 the position of auditor to the ballot at the next municipal
- 6 <u>election</u>.
- 7 (c) Transfer of duties. -- If the council eliminates the
- 8 position of elected auditor, the members of council shall:
- 9 (1) appoint an independent auditor under the provisions
- of section 1005(7) (relating to powers of council); and
- 11 (2) carry out the duties of the elected auditor under
- 12 <u>section 1001 (relating to organization of council, quorum,</u>
- 13 participation by telecommunication device, voting,
- 14 <u>compensation and eligibility</u>) pertaining to setting
- 15 <u>compensation for council members that hold other elected</u>
- 16 positions. The members of council may set their own
- 17 <u>compensation through an ordinance that may not take effect</u>
- 18 <u>until after the next municipal election and may not be</u>
- 19 <u>adjusted again for six years.</u>
- 20 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
