

- 10 (b.1) Prohibition. -- A court shall not have the authority to
- 11 order expungement of the defendant's arrest record where [the]
- 12 any of the following apply:
- 13 (1) The defendant was placed on Accelerated
- 14 Rehabilitative Disposition for a violation of any offense set
- forth in any of the following where the victim is under 18
- 16 years of age:
- 17 Section 3121 (relating to rape).
- Section 3122.1 (relating to statutory sexual assault).

- 1 Section 3123 (relating to involuntary deviate sexual intercourse). 2 Section 3124.1 (relating to sexual assault). 3 Section 3125 (relating to aggravated indecent assault). 4 Section 3126 (relating to indecent assault). 5 Section 3127 (relating to indecent exposure). 6 Section 5902(b) (relating to prostitution and related 7 8 offenses). Section 5903 (relating to obscene and other sexual 9 materials and performances). 10 (2) The defendant was placed on Accelerated 11 Rehabilitative Disposition within the previous five years for 12 an offense which occurred in the presence of a child who was 13 14 under 14 years of age. \* \* \* 15
- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
