AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 17, 2016 (P.L.84, No.16), entitled "An
2 act establishing a medical marijuana program; providing for
3 patient and caregiver certification and for medical marijuana
4 organization registration; imposing duties on the Department
5 of Health; providing for a tax on medical marijuana
6 organization gross receipts; establishing the Medical
7 Marijuana Program Fund; establishing the Medical Marijuana
8 Advisory Board; establishing a medical marijuana research
9 program; imposing duties on the Department of Corrections,
10 the Department of Education and the Department of Human
11 Services; and providing for academic clinical research
12 centers and for penalties and enforcement," in medical
13 marijuana controls, providing for access by government
14 officials.

15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
16 hereby enacts as follows:

17 Section 1. The act of April 17, 2016 (P.L.84, No.16), known
18 as the Medical Marijuana Act, is amended by adding a section to
19 read:

20 Section 706. Access by government officials.

21 (a) Access.--Access to the grounds of a medical marijuana
22 organization after business hours or if the medical marijuana
23 organization is closed to the public may be granted by the

1 department to the following individuals after submission of a
2 State-issued identification card:

3 (1) A member of the General Assembly or their staff.

4 (2) A commissioner of a county or of a township.

5 (3) A mayor.

6 (4) A member of a city council, borough council or
7 incorporated town council.

8 (5) A supervisor of a township.

9 (6) An elected official in a home rule municipality
10 similar to an individual under paragraph (1), (2), (3), (4)
11 or (5).

12 (7) A member of a zoning board.

13 (b) Accompaniment, safety and security.--An individual
14 granted access under subsection (a) shall, at all times during
15 the access, be accompanied by an employee and shall follow the
16 safety and security protocols as an employee of the facility
17 would follow.

18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
