AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, 2 special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, 3 4 primary and election expenses and election contests; creating and defining membership of county boards of elections; 5 imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; 6 7 imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, 8 revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and 9 repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to 10 elections," in nomination of candidates, further providing 11 12 for petition may consist of several sheets, affidavit of circulator. 13

- 14 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 15 hereby enacts as follows:
- 16 Section 1. Section 909 of the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333,
- 17 No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code, is amended to
- 18 read:
- 19 Section 909. Petition May Consist of Several Sheets;
- 20 Affidavit of Circulator. -- Said nomination petition may be on one
- 21 or more sheets, and different sheets must be used for signers
- 22 resident in different counties. If more than one sheet is used,
- 23 they shall be bound together when offered for filing if they are

- 1 intended to constitute one petition, and each sheet shall be
- 2 numbered consecutively beginning with number one, at the foot of
- 3 each page. In cases of petitions for delegate or alternate
- 4 delegate to National conventions, each sheet shall contain a
- 5 notation indicating the presidential candidate to whom he is
- 6 committed or the term "uncommitted." Each sheet shall have
- 7 appended thereto the affidavit of the circulator of each sheet,
- 8 setting forth--(a) that he or she is a qualified elector duly
- 9 registered and enrolled as a member of the designated party of
- 10 the State, or of the political district, as the case may be,
- 11 referred to in said petition, unless said petition relates to
- 12 the nomination of a candidate for a school director in a
- 13 district where that office is elective, a court of common pleas,
- 14 for the Philadelphia Municipal Court or for the Traffic Court of
- 15 Philadelphia or for justice of the peace, in which event the
- 16 circulator need not be a duly registered and enrolled member of
- 17 the designated party; (b) his residence, giving city, borough or
- 18 township, with street and number, if any; (c) that the signers
- 19 thereto signed with full knowledge of the contents of the
- 20 petition; (d) that their respective residences are correctly
- 21 stated therein; (e) that they all reside in the county named in
- 22 the affidavit; (f) that each signed on the date set opposite his
- 23 name; and (g) that, to the best of affiant's knowledge and
- 24 belief, the signers are qualified electors and duly registered
- 25 and enrolled members of the designated party of the State, or of
- 26 the political district, as the case may be.
- 27 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
