
AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code, in county boards of elections, further providing for powers and duties of county boards, in voting by qualified absentee electors, further providing for voting by absentee electors and for canvassing of official absentee ballots and mail-in ballots and in voting by qualified mail-in electors, further providing for voting by mail-in electors.

AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, 2 special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, 3 primary and election expenses and election contests; creating and defining membership of county boards of elections; 5 imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, 6 courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; 7 imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, 8 revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and 9 repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to 10 elections," in county boards of elections, further providing 11 for powers and duties of county boards; in voting by 12 qualified absentee electors, further providing for voting by 13 absentee electors and for canvassing of official absentee 14 ballots and mail-in ballots; and, in voting by qualified 15 mail-in electors, further providing for voting by mail-in 16 electors. 17

- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 18
- hereby enacts as follows: 19
- Section 302(p) of the act of June 3, 1937 20 Section 1.
- (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code, 21
- amended March 27, 2020 (P.L.41, No.12), is amended to read: 22
- Section 302. Powers and Duties of County Boards. -- The county 23
- boards of elections, within their respective counties, shall 24
- exercise, in the manner provided by this act, all powers granted 25

- 1 to them by this act, and shall perform all the duties imposed
- 2 upon them by this act, which shall include the following:
- 3 * * *
- 4 (p) A county board of elections shall not pay compensation
- 5 to a judge of elections who wilfully fails to deliver by two
- 6 o'clock A. M. on the day following the election envelopes;
 - 7 supplies, including all uncast provisional ballots; and returns,
 - 8 including all provisional ballots cast in the election district
 - 9 and [statements signed under sections 1306 and 1302-D.] all
- 10 material delivered under sections 1306(b)(3)(i) and 1306-D(b)(3)
- 11 <u>(i).</u>
- Section 2. Section 1306(a) introductory paragraph and (b)(3)
- 13 of the act, amended March 27, 2020 (P.L.41, No.12), are amended
- 14 and subsection (b) is amended by adding a paragraph to read:
- 15 Section 1306. Voting by Absentee Electors.--(a) Except as
- 16 provided in paragraphs (2) and (3), at any time after receiving
- 17 an official absentee ballot, but on or before eight o'clock P.M.
- 18 the day of the primary or election, the elector shall, in
- 19 secret, proceed to mark the ballot only in black lead pencil,
- 20 indelible pencil or blue, black or blue-black ink, in fountain
- 21 pen or ball point pen, and then fold the ballot, enclose and
- 22 securely seal the same in the envelope on which is printed,
- 23 stamped or endorsed "Official Election Ballot." This envelope
- 24 shall then be placed in the second one, on which is printed the
- 25 form of declaration of the elector, and the address of the
- 26 elector's county board of election and the local election
- 27 district of the elector. The elector shall then fill out, date
- 28 and sign the declaration printed on such envelope. Such envelope
- 29 shall then be securely sealed and the elector shall send same by
- 30 mail, postage prepaid, except where franked, or deliver it in

- 1 person to said county board of election[] to a member or an
- 2 employe of the county board of elections at the permanent
- 3 offices of the county board of elections, to a member or an
- 4 employe of the county board of elections at a location at the
- 5 county courthouse designated by the county board of elections or
- 6 to the judge of elections of the elector's election district at
- 7 the elector's polling place during polling hours and to no other
- 8 location.

- 12 an absentee ballot and who is not shown on the district register

- 16 spoiled and the elector signs a statement subject to the
- 17 penalties under 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904 (relating to unsworn
- 18 falsification to authorities) in substantially the following

- I hereby declare that I am a qualified registered elector who
- has obtained an absentee ballot or mail-in ballot. I further
- declare that I have not cast my absentee ballot or mail-in
- 23 ballot, and that instead I remitted my absentee ballot or
- 24 mail-in ballot and the envelope containing the declaration of
- the elector to the judge of elections at my polling place to
- 26 be spoiled and therefore request that my absentee ballot or
- 27 mail-in ballot be voided.
