

## AN ACT

Amending the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937) 1 P.L.2897, No.1), entitled "An act establishing a system of 2 unemployment compensation to be administered by the 3 Department of Labor and Industry and its existing and newly created agencies with personnel (with certain exceptions) 4 5 selected on a civil service basis; requiring employers to 6 keep records and make reports, and certain employers to pay 7 contributions based on payrolls to provide moneys for the 8 payment of compensation to certain unemployed persons; 9 providing procedure and administrative details for the 10 determination, payment and collection of such contributions 11 and the payment of such compensation; providing for 12 cooperation with the Federal Government and its agencies; 13 creating certain special funds in the custody of the State 14 Treasurer; and prescribing penalties," in compensation, 15 providing for COVID-19 base year adjustment for full-time 16 seasonal workers. 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 18 hereby enacts as follows: 19 Section 1. The act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937 20 P.L.2897, No.1), known as the Unemployment Compensation Law, is 21 amended by adding a section to read: 22 Section 409. COVID-19 Base Year Adjustment for Full-Time 23 Seasonal Workers. -- (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of 24

law, for a new claim filed for unemployment compensation between

25

- 1 December 1, 2021, and December 1, 2022, a full-time seasonal
- 2 worker who fails to meet benefit eligibility based on the
- 3 worker's current base year of qualifying wages due to a COVID-19
- 4 pandemic-related extension for unemployment compensation, may
- 5 request an alternate base year of eligibility. The request shall
- 6 be granted if the department determines that the claimant meets
- 7 the requirements of subsection (b).
- 8 (b) A claimant filing a request under subsection (a) shall
- 9 be permitted to use the year directly preceding the year that
- 10 the claimant was unemployed as an alternative base year if the
- 11 claimant:
- 12 (1) Fails to meet financial eligibility requirements when
- 13 applying for unemployment compensation benefits under this
- 14 article.
- 15 (2) Is employed full-time in a seasonal occupation.
- 16 (3) Became unemployed for any of the following COVID-19-
- 17 <u>related reasons:</u>
- 18 (i) The claimant was diagnosed with COVID-19 or experienced
- 19 symptoms of COVID-19 and a medical diagnosis was sought.
- 20 (ii) A member of the claimant's household was diagnosed with
- 21 <u>COVID-19</u>.
- 22 (iii) The claimant was required to care for a family member
- 23 or member of the claimant's household who was diagnosed with
- 24 <u>COVID-19.</u>
- 25 (iv) The claimant was absent from work to care for a child
- 26 or other member of the claimant's household due to the closure
- 27 of a school or care-related facility related to the proclamation
- 28 <u>of disaster emergency.</u>
- 29 (v) The claimant was unable to report to work:
- 30 (A) due to the proclamation of disaster emergency, COVID-19

- 1 stay-at-home order or mandatory quarantine; or
- 2 (B) after receiving advice from a healthcare provider to
- 3 self-isolate or quarantine due to exposure or suspected exposure
- 4 to an individual who tested positive for COVID-19.
- 5 (vi) The claimant was unable to start a new job due to an
- 6 inability to reach the workplace for a COVID-19-related reason.
- 7 (vii) The claimant was unable to report to work due to
- 8 assuming head-of-household duties as a result of a death of the
- 9 former head-of-household from COVID-19.
- 10 (viii) After being diagnosed with COVID-19, the claimant was
- 11 unable to perform the duties of the job resulting in loss of
- 12 employment.
- 13 (ix) Closure of the claimant's workplace due to the
- 14 proclamation of disaster emergency or another COVID-19-related
- 15 reason.
- 16 (x) The claimant was denied unemployment compensation
- 17 benefits after refusing to work at a workplace that is
- 18 noncompliant with Federal, State or local COVID-19 health and
- 19 safety measures, including wearing of facial masks, physical
- 20 distancing or the provision of personal protective equipment
- 21 consistent with public health safety guidelines.
- 22 (xi) The claimant had work hours reduced or was laid off for
- 23 reasons related to the proclamation of disaster emergency or a
- 24 <u>COVID-19-related reason.</u>
- 25 (c) For the purposes of this section, the following
- 26 <u>definitions shall apply:</u>
- 27 (1) "COVID-19" means the coronavirus disease 2019, an
- 28 <u>infectious disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome</u>
- 29 coronavirus 2 that was first identified during December 2019 in
- 30 <u>Wuhan, China.</u>

- 1 (2) "Proclamation of disaster emergency" means the
- 2 proclamation of disaster emergency issued by the Governor on
- 3 March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and
- 4 any renewal of the state of disaster emergency.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
