AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 5 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 7 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 12 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 17 18 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 19 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," in Commonwealth budget procedures, providing for 21 contract fiscal notes. 22

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 24 hereby enacts as follows:
- 25 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.E.177, No.175), known
- 26 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a
- 27 section to read:

- 1 Section 626. Contract Fiscal Notes. -- (a) A fiscal note
- 2 prepared by the Office of the Budget for a contract or contract
- 3 amendment between an agency and a vendor shall be submitted to
- 4 the Auditor General, the Chairman and Minority Chairman of the
- 5 Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the Chairman and
- 6 Minority Chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House
- 7 of Representatives at least thirty (30) days prior to the
- 8 execution of the contract or contract amendment.
- 9 (b) The fiscal note shall contain the following information:
- 10 <u>(1) The name of the agency.</u>
- 11 (2) The name of the vendor.
- 12 (3) The duration of the contract or contract amendment.
- 13 (4) The total cost of the contract or contract amendment.
- 14 (5) If the fiscal note is for a contract amendment:
- 15 (i) The original cost of the contract.
- 16 (ii) The original duration of the contract.
- 17 (6) The statutory authorization for the contract or contract
- 18 <u>amendment</u>.
- 19 (7) The appropriation to fund the contract or contract
- 20 <u>amendment.</u>
- 21 (8) A list of costs within the contract or contract
- 22 <u>amendment</u>, including:
- 23 <u>(i) Acquisition.</u>
- 24 <u>(ii) Personnel.</u>
- 25 <u>(iii) Maintenance.</u>
- 26 <u>(iv) Operation.</u>
- 27 <u>(v) Advertising.</u>
- 28 <u>(vi) Salvage value.</u>
- 29 (9) A summary of the contract or contract amendment.
- 30 (10) The need for the contract or contract amendment.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
